Wilson 9 10 11 For An Act To Be Entitled 12 "AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE 10-3-504 PERTAINING TO THE 13 14 METHOD OF SELECTING THE SPEAKER-DESIGNATE; AND FOR OTHER 15 PURPOSES." 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 18 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 10-3-504(c) is hereby amended to read as 19 20 follows: 21 "(c) As used in this section, the term "Speaker-designate" shall mean 22 the member of the House of Representatives selected by the House of 23 Representatives of each General Assembly held preceding the convening of the 24 next-following regular session of the General Assembly, in the following 25 manner: Whenever the House of Representatives shall designate a time during 26 27 a regular session to caucus for the selection of members to serve on the 28 Legislative Council and the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee, a caucus of 29 the entire House of Representatives shall be held on that date, and the 30 members of the House shall select by secret ballot a member of the House, to 31 be known as the Speaker-designate. The Speaker shall announce the results of 32 the secret ballot by announcing the number of votes received by each 33 candidate. (2) Petitions seeking pledge signatures of members of the House of 34

35 Representatives for a particular candidate seeking selection as

36 Speaker-designate shall not be circulated among the members of the House of

- 1 Representatives.
- 2 (3) The candidate receiving a majority vote of the membership of the
- 3 House of Representatives shall be declared the winner of such election for
- 4 Speaker-designate of the House of Representatives of the next following
- 5 General Assembly.
- 6 (4) If no candidate receives a majority vote of the membership of the
- 7 House of Representatives, the names of the two (2) candidates receiving the
- 8 highest number of votes cast shall be placed on a run-off ballot and
- 9 distributed among the membership of the House of Representatives in the same
- 10 manner provided above.
- 11 (5)(A) Failure of the Speaker-designate to be elected to the House of
- 12 Representatives or as Speaker of the House of Representatives of the
- 13 next-following regular session of the General Assembly shall not affect the
- 14 appointment of the members named by the Speaker-designate to serve on the
- 15 Joint Budget Committee at the regular session or at the Legislative Council
- 16 budget hearings held prior to the convening of the next-following regular
- 17 session of the General Assembly, as provided by law.
- 18 (B) However, if it is determined that the Speaker-designate will not
- 19 serve as a member of the House of Representatives of the next-following
- 20 General Assembly due to death, resignation, failure to be a candidate for
- 21 reelection in the party primary election, or failure to be reelected as a
- 22 party candidate in the primary election, a vacancy in the position of
- 23 Speaker-designate shall exist and not be filled and the Speaker of the House
- 24 of Representatives shall be elected upon convening of the next regular session
- 25 and make any Speaker-designate appointments to the Joint Budget Committee that
- 26 were not made at the time the vacancy occurred.
- 27 (6) It is the intent of this subsection that the Speaker-designate be
- 28 the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the next-following General
- 29 Assembly, subject to selection by the membership of the House upon convening
- 30 of the regular session."

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- 32 SECTION 2. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature
- 33 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
- 34 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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SECTION 3. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to
 2 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
 3 other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
 4 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
 5 Act are declared to be severable.
         SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are
 8 hereby repealed.
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         SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
11 Assembly that the procedure for selecting the Speaker-designate of the House
12 of Representatives should be changed; that this Act accomplishes the necessary
13 change; and that this Act should go into effect immediately in order to be in
14 effect when the Speaker-designate is next selected. Therefore, an emergency
15 is hereby declared to exist and this Act being immediately necessary for the
16 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and
17 effect from and after its passage and approval.
