18	SECTION 1. Ark. Code §24-3-103(c) is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2. Arkansas Code §24-7-401(c)(1)(B) is hereby amended to read

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1 as follows:
         "(B) The state employer contribution rate shall be established for
 3 fiscal years beginning July 1, 1989, and thereafter by the General Assembly
 4 upon the advice of the Joint Interim Committee on Retirement and Social
 5 Security Programs. In determining such advice, the Joint Interim Committee on
 6 Retirement and Social Security Programs shall use the following input:
               (i) The recommendation of the board based upon consultation with
 8 the board's actuary; and
 9
               (ii) Information furnished by an actuary retained by the
10 committee."

         SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
12
13 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
14 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

         SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
17 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
18 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
19 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
20 act are declared to be severable.

         SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
23 hereby repealed.

         SECTION 6. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
26 Assembly that the effectiveness of this act on July 1, 1991, is essential to
27 the sound funding of the Teacher Retirement System and the Public Employees'
28 Retirement System; that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session,
29 the delay in the effective date of this act beyond July 1, 1991, could work
30 irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential
31 governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist
32 and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health
33 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1991.
