The grievance policy shall be adopted in accordance with 17 18 Arkansas Code 6-17-201 through 6-17-207 and other applicable policies of the 19 district. 20 21 SECTION 3. The grievance policy shall at least include the following 22 provisions: (a) a procedure for resolving the matter informally with the employee's 2.3 24 immediate supervisor, 25 a procedure to appeal, in writing, an unsatisfactorily resolved 26 grievance from the immediate supervisor to the superintendent of schools or 27 his designee, (c) a procedure to appeal in writing an unsatisfactorily resolved 28 grievance from the superintendent or his designee to the school board at a hearing. The hearing shall be open to the public unless either the 31 superintendent or the employee requests a private hearing, (d) the right of all parties to be represented by a person of their own 32 33 choosing at least at the school board level of the procedure. 34 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 35

36 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code

1 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
         SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
 4 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
 5 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
 6 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
 7 act are declared to be severable.

         SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
10 hereby repealed.

         SECTION 7. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
12
13 Assembly that each school district in the State should have written grievance
14 procedures which will provide for an orderly method of resolving employee
15 concerns at the lowest possible administrative level; and that it is necessary
16 that this act be given effect immediately to enable school districts to begin
17 developing such grievance procedures as soon as possible. Therefore, an
18 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act being necessary for the
19 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and
20 effect from and after its passage and approval.
