Arkansas Code 6-62-103 is hereby amended to read as follows: 16 "6-62-103. Endowment of chairs - Attraction of exceptionally qualified 17 academic personnel. (1) Private contributors to state-supported colleges and (a) 18 19 universities frequently designate their gifts for the purpose of endowing academic chairs or attracting personnel with exceptional qualifications. 20 21 (2) In order to appropriately compensate these individuals from private 22 funds contributed for such purposes, special provisions for payments exceeding 23 maximum authorized compensation levels are necessary. The board of trustees of any state-supported college or university 24 (b) 25 in Arkansas may authorize salary or salary-related payments to individuals 26 from funds contributed for such purposes which exceed the maximum for 27 positions established by state law subject to the limitations established in 28 this section. (c) In order for the board of trustees of any state-supported college 29 30 or university to authorize additional payments as established in subsection 31 (b), the individual to receive the payments must be: Selected and recommended by the appropriate department; 32 (1)33 Approved by appropriate administrative personnel and (2)34 recommended by the president and the board of trustees; (3) The holder of an academic/research chair endowed wholly or in 35 36 part by contributions from sources other than public funds, or exceptionally

qualified non-academic personnel paid wholly from contributions from sources
 other than public funds or a visiting academic/research faculty member for a
 specified period whose service is endowed or supported wholly or in part by
 contributions from sources other than public funds.

5 (d) All funds paid to any individual above the maximum established by 6 law as authorized in this section must come from private contributions or the 7 proceeds from private contributions designated for such purposes.

8 (e) No funds as authorized in this section shall be paid to any 9 athletic personnel employed by a state-supported college or university in this 10 state."

12 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 13 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 14 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

16 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 17 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 18 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 19 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 20 act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. All laws or parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
