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19	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 19-11-259 (a)(4) is amended to read as follows:		
20	"(4) 'Commodities' shall mean materials and equipment used in the construction of		
21	public works projects."		
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23	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are		
24	amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision		
25	Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.		
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27	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the	application thereof to any person or	
28	circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of		
29	the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end		
30	the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.		
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32	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.		
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34	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby four	nd and determined by the General	
35	Assembly that the current law provides that in public purchasing of commodities, Arkansas		
36	bidders who have an established business in and are paying state and local taxes in Arkansas,		

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1	are to be given a five percent preference over out-of-state bidders who maintain no established	
2	business facility in the state and who are not paying state and local taxes in Arkansas; that this	
3	law which was obviously enacted to benefit Arkansas businesses now appears to be having the	
4	opposite effect due to the fact that some states have reciprocated by penalizing Arkansas	
5	businesses which bid on public contracts for commodities in those states, and some state	
6	agencies simply refuse to do business with Arkansas businesses because of the Arkansas	
7	preference law; and that it is in the overall best interest of Arkansas businesses that this	
8	preference be abolished as soon as possible. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to	
9	exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety	
10	shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
