35	5 It is declared to be the publi	ic policy of the State of A	rkansas that all counties,	
36	5 municipal corporations, school dist	tricts, special improveme	ent districts, and all other political

1	subdivisions of the state shall be immune from liability and from suit, except to the extent that		
2	they may be covered by liability insurance, for damages. No tort action shall lie against any		
3	such political subdivision because of the acts of their agents and employees."		
4			
5	SECTION 3. This act shall have a retroactive application to the effective date of Act		
6	542 of 1991 to avoid the misinterpretation of the intent of Act 542 as permitting suits directly		
7	against liability insurers of state and local government officials and employees. This act is		
8	intended to have retroactive effect so as to apply to any suits pending as of the effective date of		
9	this act.		
10			
11	SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of general and permanent nature are		
12	amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision		
13	Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.		
14			
15	SECTION 5. If any provisions of this act or the application thereof to any person or		
16	circumstance is held invalid, especially its retroactive application, the invalidity shall not affec		
17	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without the invalid		
18	provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.		
19			
20	SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.		
21			
22	SECTION 7. Emergency. It is hereby found and determined by the Seventy-Ninth		
23	General Assembly that a recent court decision regarding Act 542 of 1991 has led to		
24	uncertainty and confusion in the area of immunity of officials and employees of the state and		
25	local government of Arkansas; that this act is necessary to clarify the application and		
26	immunities of Act 542 of 1991 and to avoid the unintended interpretation of Act 542 as		
27	permitting suits directly against the liability insurers for state and local government officials		
28	and employees; and that it is necessary to extend its coverage retroactively to the effective date		
29	of Act 542 of 1991. Therefore, in order to prevent the misinterpretation of law, an emergency		
30	is hereby declared to exist and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the		
31	public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and		
32	approval.
