13	COORDINATING COUNCIL."
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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17	SECTION 1. This act may be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas
18	Public Transportation Coordination Act."
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20	SECTION 2. Adequate and efficient public transportation is essential to
21	the well-being of many of our State_s citizens and the economic growth of both
22	urban and rural areas. It is the purpose and intent of this act to have a
23	general public transportation policy which encourages the planning,
24	development, implementation, operation, and evaluation of efficient and
25	coordinated transportation systems, both public and private. While the
26	leadership and coordination in the development of public transportation policy
27	and programs is vested in the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
28	Department by statutory authority, a number of departments, agencies and other
29	legally constituted bodies are involved in the implementation and operation of
30	public transportation services and such policy and programs should be
31	developed with their advice and recommendations.
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33	SECTION 3. There is hereby established the Arkansas Public
34	Transportation Coordination Council which shall consist of eleven (11)
35	members. The members shall be as follows:
36	(1) There shall be three (3) members of the Council appointed by the

1 Governor to serve for terms of four (4) years. One (1) member shall be
2 appointed to represent the transit operators, and shall be directly involved
3 with the management of a public transit system. One (1) member shall be
4 appointed to represent the consumers of public transportation services. One
5 (1) member shall be appointed as a member-at-large. In the event of a vacancy
6 on the Council of one (1) of the gubernatorial positions due to death,
7 resignation, or other reason, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired
8 portion of the term by appointment of the Governor of a person meeting the
9 same qualifications required for the initial appointment.

10 (2) There shall be two (2) legislative members of the Council. One (1) 11 shall be a member of the Arkansas Senate and one shall be a member of the 12 House of Representatives and shall be appointed by and shall serve at the 13 pleasure of the President Pro Tempore and the Speaker of the House, 14 respectively.

(3) The remaining six (6) members of the Council shall be the Director of the Department of Human Services or his designee; the Director of the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department or his designee; the Director of the Arkansas State Health Department or his designee; the Director of the Arkansas Industrial Development Commission or his designee; the Director of the Office of Rural Advocacy or his designee; and the Director of the University of Arkansas Cooperative Extension Service or his designee.

(4) The Director of the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation
Department or his designee shall serve as chair. The Council shall elect by
majority vote one (1) of the non-legislative members to serve as vice-chair.

(5) The Council shall have the power to prescribe and issue pursuant to
the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, Arkansas Code 25-15-201 et seq.,
such reasonable rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the
provisions of this act.

(6) The gubernatorial members of the Council shall serve without compensation, provided that, in the event funds shall be available for such purposes, the members may be entitled to receive reimbursement for their actual and necessary expenses in attending Council meetings at a rate not to exceed the maximum established by law or regulation for travel by state employees. The legislative members shall receive, in lieu of reimbursement for meals, lodging, and travel, the same per diem and mileage allowance for

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each day of attending meetings of the Council as is authorized by law for
 attending meetings of the joint interim committees of the General Assembly and
 shall be paid from funds appropriated for that purpose.

4 (7) The Council shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at 5 the call of the chair. Six (6) members of the Council constitute a quorum, 6 and a majority vote of the members present is necessary for any action taken 7 by the Council.

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9 SECTION 4. As used in this act, unless the context otherwise requires:
10 (1) "Coordination" means the arrangement for the provision of
11 transportation to the general public in a manner that is cost-effective,
12 efficient, and reduces fragmentation and duplication of services.

(2) "Public transportation" means every conveyance of human passengers
by bus, van or any other ground surface vehicle which is provided to the
general public, or selected groups thereof, on a regular or continuing basis.

(3) "Transportation disadvantaged" means those persons who because of
physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport
themselves, therefore dependent upon others for transportation services.

19 (4) "Department" means the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation20 Department.

(5) "Council" means the Arkansas Public Transportation Coordinating22 Council.

(6) "Federal agency" means any department, office, council, or agency24 of the federal government.

(7) "State agency" means any department, board, commission, office, oragency of the State of Arkansas.

(8) "Local agency" means any entity of a city, town, municipality,
county, or other local governing body or a private nonprofit transportation
service-providing agency.

30 (9) "State" means the State of Arkansas.

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32 SECTION 5. Administrative support shall be provided by the Arkansas 33 State Highway and Transportation Department. The Department shall employ such 34 personnel as may be necessary to perform adequately the functions of the 35 Council within the limitations of the Department s biennial appropriations

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act. The Department may utilize any state appropriated funds or federal funds
 available for such purposes.

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4 SECTION 6. The Arkansas Public Transportation Coordinating Council, by 5 and through the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department, is to 6 accomplish the coordination of transportation services provided to the general 7 public, particularly the transportation disadvantaged. The goal of this 8 coordination shall be to assure the cost-effective provision of public 9 transportation by qualified transportation operators. In carrying out this 10 purpose, the Council shall:

(1) Serve as a clearinghouse for information relating to public
 transportation services, funding sources, innovations, and coordination
 efforts.

14 (2) Establish statewide objectives for providing public transportation
15 services for the general public, particularly the transportation
16 disadvantaged.

17 (3) Develop policies and procedures for the coordination of federal,
18 state, and local funding for public transportation facilities and services.
19 (4) Identify barriers prohibiting the coordination and accessibility of
20 public transportation services and aggressively pursue the elimination of

21 these barriers.

(5) Assist communities in developing public transportation systems
available for public use with special emphasis on serving the transportation
disadvantaged.

(6) Assure that all procedures, guidelines, and directives issued by
state agencies are conducive to the coordination of public transportation
services and facilities.

(7) Develop standards covering coordination, operation, costs, andutilization of public transportation services.

30 (8) Through the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department, 31 have the authority to apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts, and services 32 from federal, state, local, or private funding sources. Funds acquired or 33 accepted under this subsection shall be solely for the purpose of carrying out 34 the Council_s responsibilities.

35 (9) Review, monitor, and coordinate all funding requests for state and

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1 federal grants to be used for the provision of public transportation services.
2 Such funds shall be available only to those entities participating in an
3 approved coordinated transportation system or entity which have been granted a
4 waiver by the Council.

5 (10) Coordinate all public transportation programs with the appropriate 6 local, state, and federal agencies and public transit agencies to ensure 7 compatibility with existing transportation systems.

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9 SECTION 7. To implement the highest level of interagency cooperation, 10 each State agency, whose functions involve the administration of programs 11 which directly or indirectly funds the purchase of public transportation 12 services, equipment, facilities, or supports operating assistance shall be 13 required to issue policies advocating support for coordinated public 14 transportation and the recommendations coming forth from the Council. Each 15 State agency which is requested by the Council to submit information necessary 16 to carry out the purpose of this act shall do so in a cooperative and timely 17 manner.

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19 SECTION 8. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 20 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 21 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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23 SECTION 9. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 24 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 25 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 26 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 27 act are declared to be severable.

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SECTION 10. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
