## For An Act To Be Entitled

"AN ACT TO AMEND ARKANSAS CODE ANNOTATED § 9-14-232 TO CREATE AN ASSIGNMENT OF HEALTH CARE COVERAGE BENEFIT RIGHTS TO A CUSTODIAL PARENT WHEN THE NON-CUSTODIAL PARENT HAS BEEN ORDERED TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE COVERAGE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

## Subtitle

"AN ACT TO CREATE AN ASSIGNMENT OF HEALTH CARE BENEFIT RIGHTS TO A CUSTODIAL PARENT WHEN THE NON-CUSTODIAL PARENT HAS BEEN ORDERED TO PROVIDE HEALTH CARE COVERAGE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated § 9-14-232 is hereby amended to read as follows:
"(a) In all cases where the support and care of any children are involved, the court may order either parent to secure and maintain health care coverage for the benefit of the children when health care coverage is available or becomes available to the parent at a reasonable cost.
(b) When the non-custodial parent has secured such coverage, the signature of the custodial parent, indicated as such, shall be a valid authorization to the coverage provider or insurer for the purposes of processing a payment to the children_s health services provider. An order for health care coverage shall operate as an assignment of all benefit rights to require the insurer or coverage provider of the health care coverage to pay benefits for services rendered to the children to the custodial parent or to the children_s health services provider."

SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature

are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
    SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
act are declared to be severable.
    SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
hereby repealed.
