Subtitle 17 "TO CLARIFY THE DEFINITION OF 18 **AUXILIARY LAW ENFORCEMENT** 19 20 OFFICER AND TO ELIMINATE RESTRICTION ON COMPENSATION OF 21 **SUCH OFFICERS."** 22 2.3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: 24 25 SECTION 1. Arkansas 12-9-301(2) is amended to read as follows: 26 "(2) Auxiliary law enforcement officer means a person who meets the minimum 2.7 standards and training requirements prescribed for such officers by law and regulations, and who is appointed by a political subdivision or a law enforcement agency as a reserve officer, 29 volunteer officer, or mounted patrol but does not include any officer or deputy sheriff employed by a planned community property owners association;" 31 32 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code 12-9-307 is amended by adding a new subdivision at the 33 34 end to read as follows: "(d) An auxiliary law enforcement officer may receive such compensation, per diem, 35

36 expenses or other allowances for his services for such purposes as transporting juveniles as

1	may be agreed to by the appointing authority."
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3	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature are
4	amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision
5	Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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7	SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to any person or
8	circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of
9	the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end
10	the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.
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12	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are hereby repealed.
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14	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
15	Assembly that under present law auxiliary law enforcement officers may not receive
16	${\bf compensation} \ {\bf for} \ {\bf their} \ {\bf services}; \ {\bf that} \ {\bf this} \ {\bf restriction} \ {\bf is} \ {\bf unreasonable} \ {\bf and} \ {\bf makes} \ {\bf it} \ {\bf impossible}$
17	for political subdivisions to engage the services of such officers; that in some rural areas, there
18	is a severe shortage of law enforcement officers and some political subdivisions in such areas
19	are desirous of engaging the services of auxiliary law enforcement officers to perform certain
20	specific functions; that this act is designed to remove the restriction on compensation of
21	auxiliary law enforcement officers to enable local political subdivisions to engage the services
22	of such officers and should be given effect immediately. Therefore, an emergency is hereby
23	declared to exist and this act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health
24	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
