16	"TO AUTHORIZE THE ENFORCEMENT OF STATE
17	AND LOCAL TRAFFIC LAWS AND REGULATIONS

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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 27-49-102 is amended to read as follows:
24	"27-49-102. Applicability to operation on highways - Exceptions.
25	The provisions of this subtitle relating to the operation of vehicles
26	refer exclusively to the operation of vehicles upon highways except:
27	(1) Where a different place is specifically referred to in a given
28	section.
29	(2) The provisions of §§ 27-50-307, 27-50-308, 27-53-101 - 27-53-105,
30	and 27-53-201 - 27-53-208 shall apply upon highways and elsewhere throughout
31	the state.
32	(3) Where the owner of a private roadway within a planned community in
	Arkansas grants express permission for the state and local law enforcement
	authorities to enter on and to enforce the provisions of this subtitle and
	other traffic laws of the state or local authorities on those private roadways
36	in the planned community."

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         SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 27-49-106 is amended to read as follows:
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         "27-49-106. Powers of local authorities.
         (a) (1) No local authority shall enact or enforce any rule or
 5 regulations in conflict with the provisions of this subtitle unless expressly
  authorized in this subtitle.
               (2) Local authorities may, however, adopt additional traffic
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 8 regulations which are not in conflict with the provisions of this subtitle.
               (3) Local authorities may enact and enforce traffic rules and
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10 regulations which are not in conflict with the provisions of this subtitle for
11 private roadways, but only after being granted express permission by the owner
12 of the private roadway within the planned community.
         (b) The provisions of this subtitle shall not be deemed to prevent
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14 local authorities with respect to streets and highways under their
15 jurisdiction and within the reasonable exercise of the police power from:
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               (1) Regulating the standing or parking of vehicles;
               (2) Regulating traffic by means of police officers or traffic
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18 control signals;
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               (3) Regulating or prohibiting processions or assemblages on the
20 highways;
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               (4) Designating particular highways as one-way highways and
22 requiring that all vehicles thereon be moved in one specific direction;
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               (5) Regulating the speed of vehicles in public parks;
               (6) Designating any highway as a through highway and requiring
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25 that all vehicles stop before entering or crossing it, or designating any
26 intersection as a stop intersection and requiring all vehicles to stop at one
   (1) or more entrances to such intersections;
               (7) Restricting the use of highways as authorized in §§ 27-35-101
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29 - 27-35-111;
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               (8) Regulating or prohibiting the traffic from and use of mopeds,
31 three-wheeled vehicles, and other similar vehicles.
         (c) No ordinance or regulation enacted under subdivisions (b)(4), (5),
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33 (6), or (7) of this section shall be effective until signs giving notice of 34 local traffic regulations are posted upon or at the entrances to the highways

35 or part affected as may be most appropriate.

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No provision of this subtitle or other state traffic laws or any
 2 local traffic ordinance or regulation enacted under authority of subdivision
 3 (a)(3) of this section shall be effective on a private roadway of a planned
 4 community until signs giving notice of the owner_s grant of permission to
 5 enforce those state and local traffic regulations are posted upon or at the
 6 entrances to the planned community's private roadways or parts thereof
 7 affected."
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         SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 27-49-112 is amended to read as follows:
         "27-49-112. No interference with rights of real property owners.
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         (a) Nothing in this subtitle shall be construed to prevent the owner of
12 real property used by the public for purposes of vehicular travel by
13 permission of the owner and not as matter of right from prohibiting such use,
14 or from requiring other or different or additional conditions than those
15 specified in this subtitle, or otherwise regulating such use as may seem best
16 to such owner.
         (b) Nothing in this subtitle shall be construed to prevent the owner of
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18 a private roadway in a planned community having granted express permission for
19 the state and local law enforcement authorities to enter on and to enforce the
20 state and local traffic laws from revoking the permission and notifying the
21 state and local authorities of the revocation of the permission."
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         SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of general and permanent nature
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24 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
25 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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         SECTION 5. If any provisions of this act or the application thereof to
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28 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect
29 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
30 the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this
31 act are declared to be severable.
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33 SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 34 hereby repealed.

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SECTION 7. Emergency. It is hereby found and determined by the
 2 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas meeting in the Second
 3 Extraordinary Session of 1994 that current Arkansas laws regarding the
 4 enforcement of traffic laws prevent law enforcement officers from issuing
 5 traffic tickets on private roadways; that, in some cases, the private road
 6 ownership exceeds several hundred miles of private roads and the private
 7 owners wish to have state and local traffic laws enforced on those private
 8 roads; and that a lack of law enforcement jurisdiction on private roads,
 9 especially where the ownership exceeds several hundred miles, presents a
10 danger to the public safety. Therefore, in order to reduce the threat to the
11 safety of the motoring public, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and
12 this act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
13 health, and safety, shall be in full force and effect from and after its
14 passage and approval.
