16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF A	RKANSAS:

18	SECTION 1. (a) The General Assembly of the State	of Arkansas hereby
19	finds and declares that it is the right of every person, regardless of race,	
20	color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, age, or handicap, to be secure	
21	and protected from fear, intimidation, and physical harm caused by the	
22	activities of groups engaging in random crimes of violence, and committing	
23	crimes for profit and violent crimes committed to protect or control market	
24	areas or _turf It is not the intent of this subchapter to interfere with	
25	the constitutional exercise of the protected rights and freedoms of expression	
26	and association. The General Assembly of the State of	Arkansas hereby
27	recognizes the right of every citizen to harbor and con	stitutionally express
28	B beliefs on any lawful subject whatsoever, to associate	lawfully with others
29	who share similar beliefs, to petition lawfully constit	uted authority for a
30	redress of perceived grievances, and to participate in	the electoral process.
31	(b) The General Assembly of the State of Arkansa	s further finds that
32	the State of Arkansas is experiencing an increase in crime committed by	
33	criminal gangs, organizations, or enterprises. These criminal gangs,	
34	organizations, or enterprises support themselves by engaging in criminal	
35	activity for profit, most commonly through the distribution of controlled	
36	substances and theft of property. These criminal gangs	, organizations, or

- 1 enterprises are becoming increasingly sophisticated at avoiding arrest and
- 2 prosecution. With increasing frequency, criminals are using the property of
- 3 another person which has been stolen, borrowed, leased, or just maintained in
- 4 another person's name to avoid detection and identification. This is
- 5 particularly common among members and associates of criminal gangs,
- 6 organizations, and enterprises. There is strong evidence that this increased
- 7 sophistication is due largely to contact with other criminal gangs,
- 8 organizations, or enterprises from other states.
- 9 (c) The General Assembly of the State of Arkansas further finds that
- 10 criminal gangs, organizations, and enterprises control their market areas by
- 11 terrorizing the peaceful citizens in their neighborhoods with deliberate and
- 12 random acts of violence. Drive-by shootings are becoming all too common in
- 13 many Arkansas cities. One of the primary reasons for the increased homicide
- 14 rate is the use of firearms by criminal gangs, organizations, or enterprises
- 15 to control the crack cocaine market within their geographical \_turf\_.
- 16 (d) The General Assembly of the State of Arkansas further finds that in
- 17 addition to the activity of street gangs, there are also other types of
- 18 criminal organizations or enterprises operating in Arkansas. Some examples
- 19 are garages that take parts from stolen automobiles, burglary or retail theft
- 20 rings, and narcotics distribution organizations. The number of crimes
- 21 committed by criminal organizations of all types is increasing. These ongoing
- 22 organized criminal activities present a clear and present danger to public
- 23 order and safety and are not constitutionally protected."

- 25 SECTION 2. Definitions.
- 26 (a) \_Criminal gang, organization, or enterprise\_ is defined as any
- 27 group of three (3) or more individuals who commit a continuing series of two
- 28 (2) or more predicate criminal offenses which are undertaken in concert with
- 29 each other.
- 30 (b) \_Predicate criminal offense\_ means any violation of Arkansas law
- 31 which is a crime of violence or pecuniary gain.
- 32 (c) Crime of violence means any violation of Arkansas law where a
- 33 person purposely or knowingly causes, or threatens to cause, death or physical
- 34 injury to another person or persons, specifically including rape.
- 35 (d) \_Crime of pecuniary gain\_ means any violation of Arkansas law that

1 results, or was intended to result, in the defendant receiving income, 2 benefit, property, money, or anything of value. 3 SECTION 3. (a) Every person who by intimidation or duress, causes, 5 aids, abets, encourages, solicits, or recruits a minor to become or remain a 6 member of any group which he knows to be a criminal gang, organization, or 7 enterprise which falls into the definition and intent of this act is guilty of 8 a Class C felony. 9 (b) Every person who is found guilty of or pleads guilty or nolo 10 contendere to a second or subsequent violation of this section is guilty of a 11 Class B felony. 12 SECTION 4. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 13 14 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 15 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 16 17 SECTION 5. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 18 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 19 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 20 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 21 act are declared to be severable. 22 SECTION 6. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 2.3 24 hereby repealed. 25 It is hereby found and determined by the 26 SECTION 7. EMERGENCY. 27 Seventy-Ninth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas, meeting in the Second 28 Extraordinary Session of 1994, that street gangs have become rampant in our 29 communities and that such gangs recruit minors to engage in criminal activity. Therefore, in order to create the crime of soliciting a minor to join a 31 street gang, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act being 32 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and 33 safety, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and 34 approval.
