36	SECTION 4. Student publications policies shall recognize that truth	1,

1 fairness, accuracy, and responsibility are essential to the practice of 2 journalism, and that the following types of publications by students are not 3 authorized: (1) publications that are obscene as to minors, as defined by state (2) publications that are libelous or slanderous, as defined by state 7 law; (3) publications that constitute an unwarranted invasion of privacy, as 9 defined by state law; or (4) publications that so incite students as to create a clear and 11 present danger of the commission of unlawful acts on school premises or the 12 violations of lawful school regulations or the material and substantial 13 disruption of the orderly operation of the school. 14 15 SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 16 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 17 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 18 19 SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 20 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 21 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 22 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 23 act are declared to be severable. 2.4 25 SECTION 7.
