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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:									
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24	SECTION 1. The General Assembly has determined that the duties									
25	performed and the programs administered by the Arkansas Geological Commission									
26	are closely related to those of the Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation									
27	Commission.									
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29	SECTION 2. It is the purpose of this act to authorize the Arkansas									
30	Geological Commission at its June, 1995 meeting to, by a majority vote of its									
31	membership, enter into a voluntary merger of any or all of its programs or									
32	divisions with the Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation Commission. If the									
33	Geological Commission votes to merge any or all of its programs or divisions									
34	with the Soil and Water Conservation Commission it is further the purpose of									
35	this act that the transfer be accomplished in an expeditious, orderly and									
36	efficient manner									

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SECTION 3. (a) The merger vote shall occur at the June, 1995 meeting 2 3 of the Arkansas Geological Commission and prior to that time both the Arkansas 4 Geological Commission and the Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation Commission 5 shall hold joint public hearings and solicit input concerning the synergies 6 and benefits possible by the proposed merger. The Soil and Water Conservation 7 Commission shall provide input to the Geological Commission prior to its June 8 meeting on the Soil and Water Conservation Commission's position on the 9 merger. If the Geological Commission votes against the merger of any or all

10 11 of its programs or divisions it shall conduct a quality management review of 12 the programs of the Geological Commission and specifically review the 13 location, cost and equality of the Arkansas Geology Museum and determine 14 whether it is in the best interest of the state for the museum to remain a 15 stand alone entity or merge with the Museum of Natural Science and History or 16 other museum. The Geological Commission is authorized to transfer the museum 17 and all of its duties, powers, functions, actions, assets, properties and 18 appropriations at any time. If the Geological Commission votes to merge any 19 or all of its programs or divisions with the Soil and Water Conservation 20 Commission, the quality management review shall be conducted by the Soil and 21 Water Conservation Commission on such programs or divisions. A report of the 22 results of the quality management review shall be prepared and filed no later 23 than July 1, 1996 with the Governor, the Joint Interim Committee on State 24 Agencies and Governmental Affairs and the Joint Interim Committee on City,

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25 County and Local Affairs.

SECTION 4. Both the Arkansas Geological Commission and the Soil and 2.7 28 Water Conservation Commission shall also prepare and file no later than July 29 1, 1996 a report to the Governor, the Joint Interim Committee on State Agencies and Governmental Affairs, and the Joint Interim Committee on City, 31 County, and Local Affairs regarding the benefits of the merger in the future.

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33 In determining whether to voluntarily merge with the 34 Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation Commission, the Arkansas Geological 35 Commission shall take into consideration the best interest of the state and 1 the furtherance of the obligations of the commission.

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- 3 SECTION 6. Upon a majority vote of the membership of the Arkansas
- 4 Geological Commission to merge with the Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation
- 5 Commission, the Arkansas Geological Commission is abolished effective July 1,
- 6 1995, and its functions, powers, duties, assets, properties and appropriations
- 7 are transferred by a Type 3 transfer, as defined in Ark. Code Ann. § 25-2-106,
- 8 to the Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation Commission.
- 9 If the Geological Commission votes to transfer a portion of its programs or
- 10 divisions to the Soil and Water Conservation Commission then those programs or
- 11 divisions will be abolished effective July 1, 1995 and their powers,
- 12 functions, duties, assets, properties and appropriations are transferred by a
- 13 Type 3 transfer as defined in Ark. Code 25-2-106 to the Arkansas Soil and
- 14 Water Conservation Commission.

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- 16 SECTION 7. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
- 17 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
- 18 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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- 20 SECTION 8. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
- 21 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
- 22 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
- 23 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 24 act are declared to be severable.

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- 26 SECTION 9. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
- 27 hereby repealed.

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- 29 SECTION 10. Emergency. It is hereby found and determined by the
- 30 General Assembly that the provisions of the act are of critical importance to
- 31 preserve the efficient operation of programs that deliver services to the
- 32 citizens of the State of Arkansas; and that this act is necessary for the
- 33 efficient and economic operation of state government. Therefore, an emergency
- 34 is hereby declared to exist, and this act being necessary for the immediate
- 35 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and

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
