12	"TO DEFINE EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE"
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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16	SECTION 1. Short title. This act may be cited as the "Definition of
17	Emergency Medical Care Act."
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19	SECTION 2. Policy and purpose. Because of the need for rapid
20	assessment and care, in order to protect the life and health of the people of
21	Arkansas, during a medical emergency, it is hereby found and declared
22	necessary:
23	(1) to establish a definition for Emergency Medical Care;
24	(2) to insure that emergency medical care is provided in a timely
25	manner by licensed and qualified personnel at a hospital_s emergency
26	department;
27	(3) to insure that emergency medical care is not delayed or denied
28	based on:
29	(A) a person_s ability to pay for expenses incurred during a
3 0	medical emergency;
31	(B) prospective authorization of treatment by an insurance
32	company, health maintenance organization, hospital medical service
33	corporation, health benefit plan, or any other insurer.
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35	SECTION 3. Definitions.
36	(1) Emergency medical care refers to health care services provided in a

- 1 hospital emergency facility to evaluate and treat medical conditions of a
- 2 recent onset and severity, including, but not limited to, severe pain, that
- 3 would lead a prudent lay person, possessing an average knowledge of medicine
- 4 and health, to believe that his or her condition, sickness, or injury is of
- 5 such a nature that failure to get immediate medical care could result in:
- 6 placing the patient s health in serious jeopardy; serious impairment to bodily
- 7 functions; or serious dysfunction of any bodily organ or part.
- 8 (2) Prospective authorization means contacting any insurer, health
- 9 maintenance organization, hospital medical service corporation, or health
- 10 benefit plan who is not physically present in the hospital s emergency
- 11 department, at the time the patient presents for emergency medical care, as
- 12 defined above, for approval or authorization to evaluate and treat the
- 13 patient.
- 14 (3) Emergency medical providers refers to hospitals licensed by the
- 15 Arkansas Department of Health, hospital based services, and physicians
- 16 licensed by the Arkansas State Medical Board who provide emergency medical
- 17 care.

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- 19 SECTION 4. Procedures.
- 20 (1) Once a person qualifying for emergency medical care, based on the
- 21 definition in Section 3 (1) above, presents to an emergency department, that
- 22 person shall be evaluated by medical personnel. This evaluation may include
- 23 diagnostic testing to assess the extent of the condition, sickness, or injury
- 24 and radiographic procedures and interpretations by a radiologist.
- 25 (2) Appropriate intervention may be initiated by medical personnel to
- 26 stabilize any condition presenting under this act prior to receiving
- 27 authorization for such treatment by an insurer, health maintenance
- 28 organization, hospital medical service corporation, or health benefit plan.

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- 30 SECTION 5. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
- 31 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
- 32 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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- 34 SECTION 6. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
- 35 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect

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1 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
 2 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
 3 act are declared to be severable.
         SECTION 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
 6 hereby repealed.
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         SECTION 8. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
9 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there is an immediate and urgent need
10 to protect the lives, health, and welfare of the people of Arkansas during
11 medical emergencies which require these provisions to be authorized
12 immediately. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this act
13 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health,
14 and safety, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and
15 approval.
