23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 16-46-101(a)(2) is amended to read as follows:
26	"(2) The county recorders, clerks of courts of record, and any public
27	officer whose duty it is to make public records are authorized to use and
28	employ an approved system of photographic recording, photostatic recording,
29	microfilm, microcard, miniature photographic recording, optical disc, or other
30	process which accurately reproduces or forms a durable medium for reproducing
31	the original when provided with equipment necessary for such method of
32	recording. When any document is recorded by the means prescribed by this
33	subdivision, the original may be destroyed unless its preservation is required
34	by law."

36	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature

1 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 2 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 5 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 6 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 7 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 8 act are declared to be severable.
