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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated § 5-71-213 is hereby amended to read
24	as follows:
25	"5-71-213. Loitering.
26	(a) A person commits the offense of loitering if he lingers or remains:
27	(1) Or prowls in a public place or the premises of another
28	without apparent reason and under circumstances that warrant alarm or concern
29	for the safety of persons or property in the vicinity and, upon inquiry by a
30	law enforcement officer, refuses to identify himself and give a reasonably
31	credible account of his presence and purpose; or
32	(2) Prowls in or near a school building, not having any reason or
33	relationship involving custody of or responsibility for a student and not
34	having written permission from anyone authorized to grant permission; or
35	(3) In a public place or on the premises of another for the
36	purpose of begging; or

(4) In a public place for the purpose of unlawful gambling; or 1 In a public place for the purpose of engaging or soliciting 2. 3 another person to engage in prostitution or deviate sexual activity; or (6) In a public place for the purpose of unlawfully buying, distributing, or using a controlled substance; or 6 (7) In a public place for the purpose of unlawfully buying, distributing, or consuming an alcoholic beverage; or (8) On or about the premises of another for the purpose of spying 8 9 upon or invading the privacy of another. Among the circumstances that may be considered in determining 10 whether a person is loitering are that the person: Takes flight upon the appearance of a law enforcement 12 (1) 13 officer; or 14 (2) Refuses to identify himself; or 15 (3) Manifestly endeavors to conceal himself or any object. 16 (c) Unless flight by the actor or other circumstances make it impracticable, a law enforcement officer shall, prior to an arrest for an 18 offense under subdivision (a)(1) of this section, afford the actor an 19 opportunity to dispel any alarm that would otherwise be warranted by 20 requesting him to identify himself and explain his presence and conduct. 21 (d) It shall be a defense to a prosecution under subdivision (a)(1) of 22 this section, that the law enforcement officer did not afford the defendant an 23 opportunity to identify himself and explain his presence and conduct, or if it 24 appears at trial that an explanation given by the defendant to the officer was 25 true and, if believed by the officer at that time, would have dispelled the 26 alarm. 27 (e) Loitering is a Class C misdemeanor." 28 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 29 30 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 31 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 32 33 If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 34 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 35 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without

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1 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
 2 act are declared to be severable.
