27	SECTION 2. All provi	sions of this act of a	general and permanent nature
28	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code

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31	SECTION 3. If any pro	ovision of this act or	the application thereof to
32	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect		
33	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without

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         SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act,

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         SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is found and determined by the General
 7 Assembly that inconsistent termination provisions regarding provider taxes
 8 exist in the current codification of Subchapter 14 of Chapter 52 of Title 26
 9 of the Arkansas Code, which may provoke litigation and violate federal
10 provisions, and such provisions should be terminated. Therefore, an emergency
11 is declared to exist and, this act, being necessary for the immediate
12 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, shall be in full force
13 and effect from and after June 30, 1995.
