19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
20		
21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated 16-31-108 is amended to read as	
22	2 follows:	
23	"16-31-108. Interpreters for visually or hearing impaired jurors.	
24	(a) The state, through the Administrative Office of the Courts, shall	
25	provide, and pay the cost of reasonable accommodations for the hearing and	
26	visually impaired when necessary to enable a person with those disabilities to	
27	act as a venireperson or juror. Such accommodations may include a qualified	
28	sign language interpreter, real-time captioning, or other reasonable auxiliary	
29	aid for the hearing impaired or a reader for the visually impaired. In the	
30	event the juror indicates that he or she can be accommodated by several means,	
31	the Administrative Office of the Courts may consider the cost and availability	
32	of each accommodation when deciding which to provide. The interpreter, the	
33	person writing real-time captioning and/or reader, when necessary, shall be	
34	present throughout jury service, the trial, and when the jury assembles for	
35	deliberation.	
36	(b) Whenever a sign language interpreter, real-time captioning, or a	

- 1 reader is utilized in judicial proceedings or in jury deliberations, the court
- 2 will administer an oath to the interpreter, the person writing the real-time
- 3 captioning, and/or the reader, to ensure objective and unbiased translation
- 4 and complete confidentiality of the proceedings. The court shall also
- 5 instruct the interpreter, the person writing the real-time captioning, and/or
- 6 the reader to make a true and complete translation of all testimony and other
- 7 relevant colloquy to the best of his ability. The court shall further
- 8 instruct the interpreter, the person writing the real-time captioning, and/or
- 9 the reader to refrain from participating in any manner in the deliberations of
- 10 the jury, except for the complete translations of jurors' remarks made during
- 11 deliberations.
- 12 (c) The verdict of the jury shall be valid notwithstanding the presence
- 13 of the interpreter during deliberations."

- 15 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
- 16 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
- 17 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

- 19 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
- 20 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
- 21 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
- 22 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
- 23 act are declared to be severable.

- 25 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
- 26 hereby repealed.

- 28 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General
- 29 Assembly of the State of Arkansas that this act authorizes necessary
- 30 additional auxiliary aids for persons with hearing impairments who are called
- 31 for jury duty; this modification to Arkansas Code 16-31-108 is necessary to
- 32 enable persons with hearing impairments to serve on Arkansas juries; and this
- 33 act should go into effect immediately in order to allow for those
- 34 accommodations as soon as possible. Therefore, an emergency is hereby
- 35 declared to exist and this act being necessary for the immediate preservation
