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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 19-11-238 is hereby amended to read as
23	follows:
24	"19-11-238. Multi-year contracts.
25	(a) Specified Period. Unless otherwise provided by law, a contract for
	commodities or services may be entered into for periods of not more than seven
	(7) years if funds for the first fiscal year of the contemplated contract are
	available at the time of contracting. Payment and performance obligations for
	succeeding fiscal years shall be subject to the availability and appropriation
30	of funds therefor.
31	(b) Determination Prior to Use. Prior to the utilization of a multi-year
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33	(1) Estimated requirements cover the period of the contract and are
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35	(2) Such a contract will serve the best interests of the state by
36	encouraging effective competition or otherwise promoting economies in state

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1 procurement, and

2 (3) In the event of termination for any reason, the contract provides for 3 cessation of services and/or surrender by the state of the commodities and 4 repayment to the state of any accrued equity.

5 (c) Termination Due to Unavailability of Funds in Succeeding Years. 6 Original terms of such multi-year contracts shall terminate on the last day of 7 the current biennium and any renewals by the state based upon continuing 8 appropriation shall not exceed the next succeeding biennium. When funds are 9 not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of 10 performance in a subsequent year of a multi-year contract, the contract for 11 such subsequent year shall be terminated and the contractor may be reimbursed 12 for the reasonable value of any nonrecurring costs incurred but not amortized 13 in the price of the commodities or services delivered under the contract. The 14 cost of termination may be paid from:

(1) Appropriations currently available for performance of the contract;(2) Appropriations currently available for procurement of similar

17 commodities or services and not otherwise obligated; or

18 (3) Appropriations made specifically for the payment of such termination19 costs."

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21 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 22 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 23 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

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25 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 26 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 27 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 28 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 29 act are declared to be severable.

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31 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are 32 hereby repealed.

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34 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the General 35 Assembly that the state is hampered in the execution of its duties by the

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1	inability to use lease/purchase agreements to procure essential commodities
2	and services. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this
3	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
4	health, and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its
5	passage and approval.
