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21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Annotated § 6-18-502 is hereby amended to read
24	as follows:
25	"6-18-502. Guidelines for development of school district student
26	discipline policies.
27	(a) The Department of Education shall establish guidelines for the
28	development of school district student discipline policies.
29	(b) Such guidelines shall include, but not be limited to, the following
30	requirements:
31	(1) Parents, students, and school district personnel, including
32	teachers, shall be involved in the development of school district student
33	discipline policies;
34	(2) The student discipline policies shall be reviewed by the
35	school district's committee on personnel policies annually. The committee may
36	recommend changes in the policies to the board of directors of the local

- 1 school district.
- 2 (3) Student discipline policies shall include, but not be limited
- 3 to, the following offenses:
- 4 (A) Willfully and intentionally assaulting or threatening
- 5 to assault or abuse any teacher, principal, superintendent, or other employee
- 6 of a school system;
- 7 (B) Possession by students of any firearm or other weapon
- 8 prohibited upon the school campus by policies adopted by the school board;
- 9 (C) Using, offering for sale, or selling beer, alcoholic
- 10 beverages, or other illicit drugs by students on school property;
- 11 (D) Possession by a student of any paging device, beeper,
- 12 or similar electronic communication device on the school campus; however, the
- 13 policy may provide an exemption for possession of such a device by a student
- 14 who is required to use such a device for health or other compelling reasons;
- 15 and
- 16 (E) Willfully or intentionally damaging, destroying, or
- 17 stealing of school property by students.
- 18 (c) The school discipline policies shall:
- 19 (1) Prescribe minimum and maximum penalties, including students'
- 20 suspension or dismissal from school, for violations of each of the
- 21 aforementioned offenses and for violations of other practices prohibited by
- 22 school discipline policies; and
- 23 (2) Establish procedures for notice to students and parents of
- 24 charges, hearings, and other due process proceedings to be applicable in the
- 25 enforcement and administration of such policies by the school administrator
- 26 and by the school board; and
- 27 (3) Include prevention, intervention, and conflict resolution
- 28 provisions.
- 29 (d) Student discipline policies shall provide that parents and students
- 30 will be advised of the rules and regulations by which the school is governed
- 31 and will be made aware of the behavior that will call for disciplinary action
- 32 and the types of corrective actions that may be imposed.
- 33 (e) Each school district shall develop a procedure for written
- 34 notification to all parents and students of the district's student discipline
- 35 policies and documentation of the receipt of the policies by all parents and

         (f) Teachers and administrators shall be provided with training as
 3 needed in classroom management and in other skills relevant to student
 4 discipline.
         (q) If a school employee believes that any action taken by the school
 6 district to discipline a student referred by that employee does not follow
 7 school district discipline policies, the school employee may appeal under the
 8 district s grievance procedure as provided under § 6-17-208.
         (h) In developing the state guidelines for school district discipline
10 policies, the Department of Education shall involve parents, students,
11 teachers, and administrators."
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         SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
14 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
15 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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         SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
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18 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
19 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
20 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
21 act are declared to be severable.
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         SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
24 hereby repealed.
