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18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 22-2-107 is amended to read as follows:	
21 "22-2-107. Creation of sections.	
(a) There are created within the State Building Services the following services the followi	_
23 sections which shall have the duties and responsibilities designated by the section of the se	
24 Director of the State Building Services with the approval of the council a	
25 which may include, in relation to other provisions of this chapter, the decrease which may include, in relation to other provisions of this chapter, the	uties
26 and responsibilities respectively designated below:	
27 (1) Construction Section. The Construction Section shall:	
28 (A) Supervise the bidding and awarding of contracts for	
29 construction and renovations for or by state agencies' capital improvement	
30 (B) Approve methods of finance and establish and mainta	
31 complete construction files on all jobs including plans and specifications	s ior
32 alterations, renovations, and repairs of all capital improvements;	
33 (C) Approve all proposed contracts, change orders, and	
34 payments requests; 35 (D) Ensure that on-site inspection of all construction	
36 projects, alterations, and repairs is accomplished on a regular basis and	

- 1 maintain records of such inspections; obtain and maintain construction
- 2 inspection reports from architects or engineers or their consultants from
- 3 state agencies and institutions for all capital improvement construction
- 4 projects;
- 5 (E)(i) The design professional shall conduct visits to
- 6 determine the responsibility and performance required by the contract
- 7 documents.
- 8 (ii) On-site observations shall concur with the
- 9 contractor's payment request and shall be submitted in written form with the
- 10 pay request.
- 11 (iii) The inspection reports shall be as adopted by the
- 12 Arkansas State Building Services Council.
- 13 (iv) State agencies shall engage the services of
- 14 licensed architects or engineers for all projects covered by §§ 17-14-101 et
- 15 seq. and 17-27-101 et seq.;
- 16 (F) Ensure that the construction of all projects complies
- 17 with the contract documents.
- 18 (2) Building Operation/Maintenance Section. The Building
- 19 Operation/Maintenance Section shall:
- 20 (A) Operate, maintain, and manage public buildings as
- 21 required by the provisions of this chapter or otherwise by law;
- 22 (B) Provide for maintenance and operation including
- 23 janitorial services for any buildings, structures, or grounds which are owned,
- 24 leased, or managed by the State Building Services as may be required by the
- 25 provisions of this chapter;
- 26 (C) Develop and, upon adoption by the council, enforce
- 27 procedures, standards, and criteria designed to standardize the level of
- 28 maintenance on all public buildings and other capital improvements;
- 29 (3) Architectural Section. The Architectural Section shall be
- 30 directed by an architect registered and licensed to practice architecture in
- 31 the state who shall have had seven (7) years experience as a registered
- 32 architect. The section shall:
- 33 (A) Establish procedures, as approved by the Council, for
- 34 the selection of architectural and building design consultant services by
- 35 state agencies and the State Building Services, which procedures shall ensure

- 1 an equitable opportunity for all persons and firms;
- 2 (B) Encourage within the rules and regulations of the
- 3 state, the timely and expedient commitment and expenditure of appropriations
- 4 for construction;
- 5 (C) Establish standard fee schedules, as approved by the
- 6 Council, for architectural and building design consultant services for capital
- 7 improvements.
- 8 (D) Develop and, upon adoption by the Council, establish
- 9 minimum design standards and criteria, which shall be made available to all
- 10 architects in the state;
- 11 (E) Utilize, require, or undertake studies concerning the
- 12 needs for and costs of proposed capital improvements;
- 13 (F) Review and approve, consistent with the provisions of
- 14 this chapter, contracts for architectural and building design consultant
- 15 services, preliminary plans, cost estimates, building programs, feasibility
- 16 studies, and construction bid documents for capital improvements, and mediate
- 17 architectural design and construction related problems;
- 18 (G) Assist in analyzing architectural design and
- 19 construction problems at state owned facilities;
- 20 (H) Ensure that state agencies shall engage the services of
- 21 licensed architects and licensed engineers for all appropriate capital
- 22 improvement projects contracted, not exempted by the requirements of the
- 23 Arkansas Architectural Act Annotated Code 17-14-101 et seq., and the Arkansas
- 24 Engineering Act Annotated Code 17-27-101 et seq., and the Arkansas Public
- 25 Works Act Annotated Code 22-9-101 et seq.
- 26 (4) Leasing Section. The Leasing Section shall:
- 27 (A) Develop and enforce minimum leasing standards and
- 28 criteria for consideration and adoption by the council;
- 29 (B) Design standard lease forms to be approved by the
- 30 council for use by state agencies as provided in this chapter;
- 31 (C) Assist state agencies and the council in determining
- 32 and evaluating rental space needs and the allocation of space for state
- 33 agencies;
- 34 (D) Conduct surveys to determine available rental space
- 35 which meets minimum leasing standards and criteria and which may be available

- 1 for use by state agencies;
- 2 (E) Otherwise carry out and administer those duties and
- 3 responsibilities delegated to the Leasing Section by the director and assist
- 4 state agencies and the council to ensure that rental space acquired and
- 5 utilized by state agencies is acquired and utilized in a manner consistent
- 6 with the intent of this chapter so that no state agency shall lease space
- 7 which is not absolutely essential to the efficient performance of its duties
- 8 and responsibilities.
- 9 (5) Engineering Section. The Engineering Section shall be
- 10 directed by an engineer registered and licensed to practice engineering in the
- 11 state who shall have had seven (7) years experience as a registered engineer.
- 12 The section shall:
- 13 (A) Establish procedures as approved by the council, for
- 14 the selection of engineering and environmental services by state agencies and
- 15 the State Building Services, which procedures shall ensure an equitable
- 16 opportunity for all persons and firms;
- 17 (B) Encourage within the rules and regulations of the
- 18 state, the timely and expedient commitment and expenditure of appropriations
- 19 for construction;
- 20 (C) Establish standard fee schedules, as approved by the
- 21 council, for engineering and environmental services for capital improvements;
- 22 (D) Develop and, upon adoption by the council, establish
- 23 minimum design standards and criteria, which shall be made available to all
- 24 engineers in the state;
- 25 (E) Utilize, require, or undertake studies concerning the
- 26 needs for the costs of proposed capital improvements;
- 27 (F) Review and approve, consistent with the provisions of
- 28 this chapter, contracts for engineering and environmental services,
- 29 preliminary plans, construction plans, and construction bid documents for
- 30 capital improvements;
- 31 (G) Assist in analyzing engineering problems at state owned
- 32 facilities;
- 33 (H) Ensure that state agencies shall engage the services of
- 34 licensed architects and licensed engineers for all appropriate capital
- 35 improvement projects contracted, not exempted by the requirements of the

1 Arkansas Architectural Act Annotated Code 17-14-101 et seq., the Arkansas 2 Engineering Act, Annotated Code 17-27-101 et seq., and the Arkansas Public 3 Works Act Annotated Code 22-9-101 et seq. The director may transfer the various duties and functions among 5 the various sections of the State Building Services and effect any other 6 organizational or administrative changes as may be necessary to bring about 7 the efficient and effective implementation of this chapter." a 9 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature 10 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code 11 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code. 12 13 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to 14 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect 15 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without 16 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this 17 act are declared to be severable. 18 19 SECTION 4.
