MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - VOCATIONAL 33 TRAINEES. The Division of Mental Health Services of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized during the 1997-99 biennium to provide 34 35 employment opportunities for some of the working residents who are separate

1	from the currently authorized regular vocational trainee positions. The

The costs of any law, 19 rule, or regulation adopted by the State of Arkansas or federal government 20 mandating a specific expenditure or cost required for state licensure or 21 participation in the Medicaid program shall be reimbursed as a fully allowable 22 cost for 10-bed ICF/MR facilities participating in the Medicaid program. 23 However, this section shall be void if not approved by HCFA (Health Care 24 Financing Administration). 25

It is hereby found and determined by 2.6 27 the Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of 28 Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the 29 operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, 30 and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the 31 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 1997 could work irreparable harm 32 33 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 34 programs.
