25	SECTION 1. It is the intent and purpose of the	s act to transfer the
26	26 authority and responsibility for administration of th	e Arkansas Entertainers
27	27 Hall of Fame from the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of B	ame Board to the Arkansas
28	28 Department of Parks and Tourism; to continue the Arka	nsas Entertainers Hall of
29	9 Fame Board with the authority and responsibility only	to meet annually to
30	80 select entertainers for induction into the Entertaine	ers Hall of Fame and to
31	plan and supervise the annual ceremony for the induction of entertainers into

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- 1 SECTION 2. All powers, functions and duties of the Arkansas
- 2 Entertainers Hall of Fame Board with respect to the administration and
- 3 promotion of the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame program, except the
- 4 function of annually selecting the entertainers who are to be inducted into
- 5 the Entertainers Hall of Fame and the planning and supervision of the annual
- 6 ceremony for inducting entertainers into the Hall of Fame, which are hereby
- 7 reserved to the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame Board, are hereby
- 8 transferred to and shall hereafter be exercised by the Arkansas Department of
- 9 Parks and Tourism.

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- 11 SECTION 3. All Hall of Fame Cash Fund balances as reflected in the
- 12 books of the Chief Fiscal Officer, the Treasurer of State, and the Auditor of
- 13 State are hereby transferred to the Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism
- 14 to be maintained in a separate account and used for the administration and
- 15 promotion of the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame program.

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- 17 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 13-9-101(c)(2) is amended to read as
- 18 follows:
- 19 "(2) The board shall meet quarterly and at those other times
- 20 which its rules and bylaws may prescribe annually."

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- 22 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code 13-9-103 is amended to read as follows:
- "13-9-103. Functions and powers.
- 24 (a) It shall be the function and main purpose of the board to
- 25 honor those, living or dead, who, by achievement or service, have made
- 26 outstanding and lasting contributions to entertainment in Arkansas or
- 27 elsewhere, by annually selecting Arkansas entertainers for induction
- 28 into the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame.
- 29 (b)(1) The board may adopt any rules, regulations, and bylaws
- 30 which may be needed to carry out its functions.
- 31 (2) It may also conduct surveys and polls and may appoint any
- 32 committees and representatives which it may determine to be necessary or
- 33 desirable.
- 34 (3) The board may acquire suitable quarters to be used by the
- 35 board for the display of busts, statues, plaques, books, papers,
- 36 pictures, and other exhibits relating to entertainment. It shall also be

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- 1 the responsibility of the board to plan and supervise the annual
- 2 ceremony for the induction of Arkansas entertainers into the Arkansas
- 3 Entertainers Hall of Fame.
- 4 (c) The board may adopt appropriate rules and regulations
- 5 concerning the procedures to be followed in selecting inductees."

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- 7 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 13-9-104 is amended to read as follows:
- 8 "13-9-104. Donations.
- 9 The board Department of Parks and Tourism may solicit and accept
- 10 donations, contributions, and gifts of money and property to be used for
- 11 the support of the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame program. All
- 12 property, money, income, and resources, and activities of the board
- 13 Department received for support of the program shall be exempt from
- 14 taxation. All and all gifts made to the board Department shall also be
- 15 tax exempt from taxation."

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- 17 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code 13-9-102 is hereby repealed.
- 18 <u>13-9-102. Office space and staff.</u>
- 19 The board shall be domiciled within the State of Arkansas, where
- 20 it shall maintain halls, rooms, or quarters which are considered
- 21 suitable and appropriate for conducting its affairs. The board may
- 22 appoint an executive secretary or director and such staff as may be
- 23 necessary for the performance of its duties and functions.

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- 25 SECTION 8. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent
- 26 nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the
- 27 Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the
- 28 Code.

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- 30 SECTION 9. If any provision of this act or the application
- 31 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity
- 32 shall not affect other provisions or applications of the act which can
- 33 be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to
- 34 this end the provisions of this act are declared to be severable.

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36 SECTION 10. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act

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1	are hereby repealed.	
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3	SECTION 11. EMERGENCY. It is hereby found and determined by the	
4	General Assembly that it is essential to the effective and efficient	
5	administration of the Arkansas Entertainers Hall of Fame program that	
6	the responsibility for administering and promoting the program be place	
7	in the Department of Parks and Tourism as soon as possible and that this	
8	act is designed to accomplish this purpose and should be given effect	
9	immediately. Therefore an emergency is declared to exist and this act	
10	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,	
11	health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by	
12	the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the	
13	Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of	
14	time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed	
15	by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective or	
16	the date the last house overrides the veto.
