    SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. ARKANSAS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL.
Thirty-three and one-third percent (33-1/3%) in each fiscal year of the
biennial period ending June 30, 1999, of the amounts made available to fund
the appropriation in Item (07) of Section 6 of this Act shall be distributed
to the Arkansas Children's Hospital.
    SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. SPECIAL ALLOWANCES. The Board of
Trustees may make special allowances available, in such amounts as the Board
may determine or justify equitable in view of the exacting duties which are
involved, as a part of the salaries of the physicians, dentists, and other
professional faculty employed by the University of Arkansas for Medical
seienees from meceipts of professional ineome in the cave of patients amelor
funds received from federal agencies, foundations, and other private sponsors
in support of research. Provided that any such allowance shall not exceed, for
any employee, an amount equal to two (2) times that portion of the salary
authorized by the General Assembly to be paid from the University of Arkansas
Medical Center Fund.
    SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. SPECIAL ALLOWANCES. The Board of
Trustees of the University of Arkansas is hereby authorized to make available
to the President of the University of Arkansas special allowances in such
amounts as the Board may determine to be justified at the University of
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Arkansas for Medical Sciences, for the use of the Chancellor and his deans,
representatives, department heads, and directors at the University of Arkansas
for Medical Sciences in recruitment of faculty and staff members. Upon
approval by the President and the Board of Trustees, such funds shall be
administered by the Chancellor, who shall assure that the total amount
expended for such purposes does not exceed one hundred fifty thousand dollars
\((\$ 150,000)\) each fiscal year or so much thereof as may be authorized by the
Board of Trustees. The funds authorized by this Section shall come from a
source other than state tax dollars appropriated by the General Assembly or
charges made to students for tuition, fees, room and board, or other purposes.
    Each year the Chancellor shall furnish to the President of the University of
Arkansas, the Board of Trustees, and the Arkansas Legislative Joint Auditing
13 Committee a report showing for each expenditure the date, the amount, the
names of persons to whom the expenditure was made, and the purpose for which
the expenditure was made.
    SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. SPECIAL LANGUAGE AND RESTRICTIONS - AREA
    HEALTH EDUCATION CENTERS. The Chancellor at the University of Arkansas for
    Medical Sciences shall make periodic progress reports of AHEC programs to the
    Governor, the Legislative Council, and other interested interim committees of
    the General Assembly regarding the achievements, the expansion of the
    aforementioned programs, and amounts expended for the Area Health Education
    Centers.
    SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. CONTRACT RESTRICTIONS (PHYSICIAN

    EDUCATION CENTERS. Funds appropriated by this Act may be utilized for the
    purpose of contracting with physician-teachers and teachers in other health

    Contracts entered into with physician-teachers, teachers in other health

    SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. DAY CARE. Of the funds appropriated in Section 6 of this Act, $\$ 250,000$ each year of the biennium may be allocated as
the State's portion of the operating cost of a Child Care Facility of the
University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. Individuals using this facility
will be charged a daily rate as determined by the University of Arkansas for
Medical Sciences.

SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of the general revenue appropriations and funds provided by this Act which
remains at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1998, not to exceed
ten percent (10\%) of funded appropriations, shall be carried forward and made
available for the same purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1999.

    SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR ON-CALL STATUS
    AND STAND-BY PAY FOR CERTAIN CLASSIFIED EMPLOYEES WORKING IN CRITICAL AREAS.
    All classified positions employed in areas providing critical and emergency
    support of the clinical and physical operations of the University of Arkansas
    for Medical Sciences and required to work outside their normal work schedule

            SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. ESTABLISHMENT OF A "GROWTH POOL". The

    salary level not to exceed $102,504 per year. These positions are to be used
    by the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences in the event that the

    during the 1997-99 biennium exceed the number of positions in a classification
    allocated to the University by the Legislature. The University shall provide
    justification to OPM for the need to allocate titles from this "growth pool".
    No classifications will be assigned to the pool until such time as specific
    positions are requested by the University, recommended by OPM, and reviewed by
    the Legislative Council.
    SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The provisions of Arkansas Code 86-61-
    105 and 86-61-106 shall not apply to students selected to be admitted to the
    University of Arkansas School of Medicine or the University of Arkansas School
    of Pharmacy.
    SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. The Child Health and Family Life
    Institute shall be administered under the direction of Arkansas Children's
    Hospital. Arkansas Children's Hospital shall enter into a cooperative
    agreement and/or contract with the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
    - Department of Pediatrics for services required in delivering the programs of
    the Child Health and Family Life Institute. The KIDS FIRST Program, a
    component of the Child Health and Family Life Institute, shall receive
    priority consideration above all other programs of the Institute when funding
    decisions are made by Arkansas Children's Hospital. Arkansas Children's
    Hospital shall make quarterly reports to the Arkansas Legislative Council on
    matters of funding, existing programs and any new programs and/or services
    offered through the Child Health and Family Life Institute.
    The Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences shall
    designate an individual from the Department of Pediatrics who shall provide
    adminstrative oversight of the cooperative agreements and/or contracts with
    Arkansas Children's Hospital in delivering the programs of the Child Health
    and Family Life Institute. The designated administrator from the University
    of Arkansas for Medical Sciences-Department of Pediatrics shall make quarterly
    reports to the Chancellor of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences
    and the Arkansas Legislative Council on all matters of funding, existing
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programs and services offered through the Child Health and Family Life
Institute. Further, the Department of Pediatrics shall make every effort to
advance the KIDS FIRST Program statewide.

SECTION 26. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this Act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditure Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 27. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this Act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this Act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 28. CODE. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.

SECTION 29. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are declared to be severable.

SECTION 30. GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict

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with this Act are hereby repealed.
    SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
Eighty-First General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas
prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that
the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 1997 is essential to the operation of
the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
date of this Act beyond July 1, }1997\mathrm{ could work irreparable harm upon the
proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 1997.
