Arkansas Code 7-5-416 (a) and (b) are amended to read as 20 follows: 21 "(a) The election officials for absentee ballots shall meet in the 22 courthouse in a place designated by the county board of election commissioners on election day for the purpose of processing absentee ballots. No election 23 results may be printed or released prior to the close of the polls. The county 24 board of election commissioners shall post at the county clerk's office the 25 time and location of opening, canvassing, and counting of absentee ballots. 26 27 The county clerk shall forward the absentee ballot applications sorted alphabetically or by precinct to the election officials for absentee ballots. 28 29 Candidates may be present in person at any election, and in general or special elections candidates and political parties may be present by 30 31 representative, designated in writing, during the opening, canvassing, and counting of the absentee ballots as provided in this subchapter. 32 The opening, counting, and canvassing shall be conducted as 33 follows: 34 (1) One (1) of the election officials shall open outer absentee 35 ballot envelopes one-by-one, and as soon as he opens one (1), he shall read 36

1 aloud from the statement in the envelope the name of the voter and the voting 2 precinct in which the voter claims to be a legal voter;

- (2) As each outer envelope is opened and the name of the voter is read, the election officials for the absentee box shall list in duplicate the name and voting precinct of the voter and shall write on the stub end of the ballot taken from the outer envelope the number of the voter taken from this list of voters;
- (3) After the election official reads aloud from the statement, the election officials shall compare name, address, date of birth, and signature of the voter's absentee application and voter's statement. If the application and the voter statement does not compare as to name, address, date of birth and signature, the application, absentee ballot envelope and statement shall be placed in an envelope marked 'challenged.' The election official shall record the reason for the challenge on the envelope and it shall be referred to the County Board of Election Commissioners. The County Board of Election Commissioners shall determine if the voter is qualified and whether or not the vote shall be counted.
 - (3)(4) If no challenge is made and the statement is in proper form, the election official shall, without opening the inner envelope containing the ballot, remove the inner envelope and place it in the ballot box without marking it in any way. Proper form shall include the voter's signature;
 - (4) (5) The ballot stub ends shall be placed in a separate ballot box designated for them and retained as are other ballot stub ends;
 - (5)(6) After all of the outer envelopes have been opened and a list has been made in duplicate of the name and voting precinct of the voters, as required herein, the election officials of the absentee box shall preserve all the statements of voters and deliver them to the county clerk who shall file and keep them for the same length of time after the election as required for retention of other ballots, and the statements shall be made available for public inspection during regular business hours;
 - (6)(7) When all of the inner envelopes containing the ballots have been placed in the ballot box and the ballot stub ends have been deposited in a separate box, the ballot box shall be shaken thoroughly so as to mix the ballots;

1	and counted. No election results shall be printed or released prior to the
2	close of the polls."

4	SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
5	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
6	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
7	
8	SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
9	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
10	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
11	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
12	act are declared to be severable.
13	
14	SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
15	hereby repealed.
