(d) At the request of the Director of the Department of Human Services, and 34 35 upon certification of the availability of such funds, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall initiate the necessary transfer documents to reflect the 36

transfer on the books of record of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of 1 2 State, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and the Department of Human 3 Servi ces. A medical doctor in Mental Health Services Division can be paid at any rate within the range specified in Section 1 herein. Pay rates 17 18 for physicians and chief psychologists within the Division of Mental Health Services may include the special allowances available to UAMS physicians and 19 professional faculty as described in the special language of the UAMS 20 appropriation. Part of the salaries of such staff will come from the receipt 21 22 of professional income in the care of patients and/or funds received from 23 federal agencies, foundations and other private sponsors in the support of research. Provided that any such allowance shall not exceed, for any 24 employee, an amount equal to two and one half times the salary authorized by 25 the General assembly. 5 SECTION 118. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 6 MENTAL 7 HEALTH SERVICES - VOCATIONAL TRAINEES. The Division of Mental Health Services of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized during the 1997-99 8 9 1999-2001 biennium to provide employment opportunities for some of the working 10 residents who are separate from the currently authorized regular vocational 11 trainee positions. The 8 9 Department of Human Services shall not contract or pay for community-based residential programs within any municipality to house unrelated persons who 10 11 have been adjudicated delinquent of an act that would constitute a Class A 12 felony or higher or of a sexual offense or convicted of a Class A felony or higher or sexual offense until the following conditions have been met: 13 14 1. Residents within one thousand (1,000) feet of the proposed location of the 15 facility shall be notified by mail; 16 2. A public hearing shall be conducted in the community of the proposed location of the facility by the contract provider at least ten (10) days in 17 18 advance of the contract's effective date. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 17 SECTION 133. 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MEDI CAL 19 SERVICES - STATE MEDICAID PROGRAM/PERSONAL CARE PROGRAM. It is the Legislative intent that the Department of Human Services in its administration 20 21 of the Arkansas Medicaid Program set forth Medicaid provider participation 22 requirements for "personal care providers" that will insure sufficient 23 available providers to meet the required needs of all eligible recipients, to 24 include insuring available in-home services twenty-four hours a day and seven days a week for personal care. For the purposes of this section, "private 25 26 care agencies" are defined as those providers licensed by the Department of 27 Labor as of January 1, 1999, certified as ElderChoices Providers as of January 28 1, 1999 and who furnish in-home staffing services for respite, chore services, 29 and homemaker services, and carrying liability insurance of not less than one 30 million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) covering their employees and independent 31 contractors while they are engaged in providing services, such as personal 32 care, respite, chore services, and homemaker services. The purpose of this 33 section is to allow the private care agencies defined herein to be eligible to 34 provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care services on Saturdays and Sundays 35 only, and does not supercede Department of Human Services rules establishing 36 monthly benefit limits and prior authorization requirements. The availability

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of providers shall not require the Department of Human Services to reimburse 1 2 for 24 hours per day of personal care services. The Arkansas Department of 3 Human Services, Medical Services Division shall take such action as required by the Health Care Financing Administration to amend the Arkansas Medicaid 4 manual to include, private care agencies defined herein, as qualified entities 5 to provide Medicaid reimbursed personal care services. The private care 6 7 agencies defined herein shall comply with rules and regulations promulgated by the Arkansas Department of Health which shall establish a separate licensure 8 9 category for the private care agencies defined herein for the provision of 10 Medicaid reimbursable personal care services on weekends. The Arkansas Department of Health shall supervise the conduct of the private care agencies 11 12 defined herein. The purpose of this section is to insure the care provided by 13 the private care agencies defined herein, is consistent with the rules and regulations of the Arkansas Department of Health. 14 15 SECTION 134. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MEDICAL 17 18 SERVICES - BORDER CITY DDTCS PROVIDERS. Approved Arkansas Medicaid providers of Developmental Day Treatment Clinic Services (DDTCS), or its successor 19 20 program, who have out-of-state border city facilities may be reimbursed for Medicaid eligible services delivered to Arkansas residents who are Medicaid 21 22 eligible. 23 SECTION 135. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized 24

by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds 25 26 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary 27 28 Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures 29 and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of 30 31 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied 32 with in disbursement of said funds.

GENERAL REPEALER. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with 19 this act are hereby repealed. 20 SECTION 140. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.
