- (2) At the first meeting of the board, the seven (7) positions shall be filled by those persons who served as board members immediately prior to August 1, 1997, with any vacancies thereafter filled by a majority vote of the remaining board members of the resource center.
- (b) The board of directors of the resource center shall function as a public corporate body, shall meet at least four (4) times each year, and shall exercise general fiduciary responsibilities for the resource center with regard to policies and practices which guard the integrity of the center and maintain public trust in its operation.
- (c) The responsibilities of the board, consistent with funds available, shall include, but not be limited to:
- (1) Establishment of policies and procedures for the operation and management of the resource center, which shall be in written form and shall be filed with the State Board of—Vocational—Education Workforce

 Education and Career Opportunities;
- (2) Preparation of an annual budget estimating income and expenditures for programs and services in accordance with procedures approved by the State Board of Vocational Education Workforce Education and Career Opportunities;
- (3) Receipt and expenditure of funds needed to provide programs and services in the area;
- (4) Renting, leasing, or receiving by gift such facilities and buildings as may be required to provide authorized programs and services;
- (5)(A) Making such surveys or other inquiries which may be required to determine the service needs of school districts, other vocational, technical, or adult programs, and business and industry in the area served by the resource center; and
 - (B) developing plans to provide such needed services;
- 32 (6) Cooperation with school districts, other vocational, 33 technical, or adult programs, business and industry, and other agencies to 34 provide programs and services for children and adults residing within the 35 areas:
 - (7) Employment of a director of the resource center who shall

serve as the nonvoting executive officer of the board of directors;

- 2 (8) Employment, upon the recommendations of the director of the 3 resource center, of such personnel as may be required to provide the services 4 requested in the area; and
 - (9) Carrying out such other duties as may be required for the efficient operation of the resource center for which the board is responsible.
 - (d) The board may petition the State Board of Vocational Education Workforce Education and Career Opportunities to establish a vocational and technical center which will provide, consistent with funds available, vocational and technical education opportunities to students."

12 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code 6-51-1005 is amended to read as follows: 13 "6-51-1005. Policies and procedures - Expenditures, reports, and audits.

- (a) In consultation with the State Board of Vocational Education Workforce Education and Career Opportunities, the policies and procedures and a strategic plan for the operation of the resource center shall be developed and filed with the board prior to the opening of the center. These documents shall be updated annually and filed with the board on or before June 1 of each year.
- (b)(1) Reports of receipts and expenditures shall also be filed with the board on forms provided and time schedules set by the Director of Vocational and Technical Education the Department of Workforce Education and Career Opportunities. These reports shall contain, but not be limited to, an itemization of administrative and programmatic expenditures.
- (2) Expenditures shall be reported in accordance with uniform accounting procedures adopted by the Vocational and Technical Education

 Division Department of Workforce Education.
- (c) The resource center shall be subject to annual audits by the Division of Legislative Audit. $^{\prime\prime}$
- SECTION 4. Arkansas Code 6-51-1006 is amended to read as follows: "6-51-1006. Programs and services.
- (a) The programs and services of the resource center shall be based upon the needs of the school districts and other vocational, technical, or adult programs included in its service area and upon the educational priorities of the state.

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1	(b) The resource center may provide vocational-technical educational						
2	programs and services which the State Board of Vocational Education Work						
3	<u>Force Education and Career Opportunities</u> may approve or which school districts						
4	or other vocational, technical, or adult programs may support with local

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13	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code 6-51-1009 (b) is amended to read as follows:						
14	"(b) Certificate requirements shall be the same as those expected of

17	Education may grant a waiver from this subsection in exceptional

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20	SECTION 7. Arkansas Code 6-51-1010 is amended to read as follows:

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27	SECTION 8. All provisions of this Act of a general and permanent nature						
28	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code

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31	SECTION 9. If any provision of this Act or the application thereof to						
32	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect						
33	other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without
