Arkansas Code 20-78-501 is amended to read as follows: 21 22 "20-78-501. Creation - Composition - Meetings. 23 (a) There is hereby established the Arkansas Early Childhood Commission 24 to be composed of eighteen (18) members appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate. The members of the commission shall serve for 25 three-year terms. The terms of the members of the commission shall begin on 26 July 1. The chairman of the commission shall be selected annually by majority 27 28 vote of the commission. 29 (b) The membership of the commission shall be as follows: (1) Three (3) members affiliated with child care provider 30 31 agencies, organizations, or programs; (2) One (1) member affiliated with a Head Start program; 32 (3) One (1) member affiliated with a HIPPY program; 33 One (1) member employed as an administrator by a public 34 (4) 35 school district: 36 One (1) member employed by a public school district as a (5)

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1 teacher with early childhood responsibilities;

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- 2 (6) The Director of the Department of Health or her designee;
- 3 (7) One (1) member trained as early childhood education 4 professionals;
- 5 (8) One (1) member who is a parent of a child who attends a 6 childcare program;
- 7 (9) The Director of the Vocational and Technical Division of the 8 Department of Education, or its successor, or his designee;
- 9 (10) The Director of the General Education Division of the 10 Department of Education or his designee;
- 11 (11) Two (2) members representing the business community who have 12 an interest in early childhood education;
- 13 (13)(12) The chair of the House Subcommittee on Children and
 14 Youth of the House Committee on Aging, Children and Youth, Legislative and
 15 Military Affairs or the chair's designee;
- 16 (14)(13) The chair of the Senate Committee on Children and Youth 17 or the chair's designee;
- 18 $\frac{(15)}{(14)}$ The chair of the House Committee on Education or the 19 chair's designee; and
 - $\frac{(16)}{(15)}$ The chair of the Senate Committee on Education or the chair's designee.
 - (c) The commission shall meet at least quarterly and at such other times as may be deemed necessary for the performance of the duties of the commission. Special meetings of the commission may be called by the chairman or by agreement of a majority of the members of the commission.
 - (d) The members of the commission shall serve without compensation or per diem but shall be entitled to reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in the performance of duties as members of the commission. Expense reimbursement shall be in accordance with state travel and official business expense reimbursement procedures and regulations. Expense reimbursement shall be paid from funds appropriated to the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education for such purposes.
 - (e) Members of the commission serving on August 1, 1997, except those members whose positions have been eliminated by this act, shall continue to serve out their terms.
 - (f) The commission shall report annually to the House Education

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4	Section 2. Arkansas Code 20-78-502 is amended to read as follows:
5	"20-78-502. Duties - Assistance.
6	(a) The Arkansas Early Childhood Commission shall have the following
7	duties and responsibilities <u>and shall annually report their progress toward</u>
8	the following:
9	(1) Advise the division on the administration of the Arkansas
10	Child Care Facilities Loan Guarantee Trust Fund;
11	(2) Provide technical assistance in design of training programs
12	to enhance the skills of professionals in early childhood programs, including
13	the development of an annual comprehensive training plan for providers;
14	(3) Examine the recommendations of national and regional groups
15	and systems producing scientifically proven and cost effective results used by
16	others to provide child care and early childhood services;
17	$\frac{(3)}{(4)}$ Assist in development of a comprehensive long-range plan
18	for expansion, development, and implementation of early childhood programs in
19	Arkansas including recommending allocation and expenditures of funds
20	appropriated to the Arkansas Better Chance Program;
21	$\frac{(4)}{(5)}$ Facilitate coordination and communication among state
22	agencies providing early childhood programs to promote nonduplication and
23	coordination of services in such programs <u>and recommend a structure for the</u>
24	administration of the current existing programs and the recommended programs;
25	(5)(6) Advise the General Education Division of the Department of
26	Education and other appropriate state agencies on the development of
27	programmatic standards for early childhood programs to be funded with funds
28	appropriated to the General Education Division or to such other state agencies
29	as may receive appropriations for such purposes;
30	$\frac{(6)}{(7)}$ Promote strong local community support for early childhood
31	education programs;
32	$\frac{(7)(8)}{(8)}$ Promote public awareness of childcare and early childhood
33	programs.
34	(b) The Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education shall

assist the commission in carrying out its duties and responsibilities. $^{\prime\prime}$

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1	SECTION 3. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
2	are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
3	Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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5	SECTION 4. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to
6	any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
7	other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
8	the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
9	act are declared to be severable.
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11	SECTION 5. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
12	hereby repealed.
