10 "AN ACT TO ADD A SUBSECTION TO ARKANSAS CODE 8-9-405,
11 TO EXPAND THE WASTE TIRE GRANT PROGRAM BY SETTING
12 ASIDE A PORTION OF THE WASTE TIRE GRANT FUND CURRENTLY
13 AVAILABLE TO REGIONAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICTS
14 IN ORDER TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL AID WHEREVER NEEDED;
15 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. "

Subtitle

17 "AN ACT TO EXPAND THE WASTE TIRE GRANT
18 PROGRAM. "
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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code 8-9-405 is amended to add a new subsection to
25 read as follows:

26 "(e) The department shall expand the waste tire grant program by
27 setting aside a portion, not to exceed ten percent (10%), of the waste tire
28 grant fund available, other than those established in Arkansas Code § 8-9-
29 404(a)(2)(B), to regional solid waste management districts, in order to
30 provide supplemental aid wherever needed."
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32 SECTION 2. All provisions of this act of a general and permanent nature
33 are amendatory to the Arkansas Code of 1987 Annotated and the Arkansas Code
34 Revision Commission shall incorporate the same in the Code.
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36 SECTION 3. If any provision of this act or the application thereof to

1 any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
2 other provisions or applications of the act which can be given effect without
3 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
4 act are declared to be severable.

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6 SECTION 4. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act are
7 hereby repealed.

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9 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is hereby found and determined by the
10 Eighty-second General Assembly that the law concerning the waste tire grant
11 program is inadequate for the protection of the public. Regional Solid Waste
12 Management Districts are dependent on adequate grant funding, which this bill
13 would provide. Without adequate funding, the Districts' efforts to manage
14 waste tires, which can result in a blight on the countryside and hazardous and
15 unhealthy conditions, would be hindered. Therefore, an emergency is declared
16 to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
17 public peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its
18 approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the
19 Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time
20 during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the
21 Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the
22 last house overrides the veto.
