Therefore, an emergency 16 is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on 17 18 the date of its approval by the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the 19 period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill.
