Arkansas Code Title 16, Chapter 17, Subchapter 1, regarding setting out general provisions for municipal courts, is amended to add an 24 25 additional section to read as follows: 26 16-17-131. (a) A person required to appear before a municipal court in this state, having been served with any form of notice to appear for any 27 criminal offense, traffic violation, or misdemeanor charge, shall appear at 28 29 the time and place designated in the notice. (b)(1) If a person fails to appear as required in subsection (a) of 30 31 this section, the presiding judge may suspend the person's driver's license. 32 (2) The license shall be suspended until the person appears and completes the sentence ordered by the court. 33 (3) After the person satisfies all the requirements of the 34 35 sentence, the Department of Finance and Administration shall assess the 36 current fees for reinstatement of a driver's license.

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2	SECTION 2. <u>EMERGENCY</u> . It is found and determined by the General
3	Assembly that there is a substantial risk of continued failures to appear by
4	persons served with notice to appear in municipal courts, thus weakening
5	enforcement of the traffic and criminal laws of Arkansas and endangering
6	travelers on Arkansas' highways. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist
7	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public
8	peace, health and safety shall become effective on the date of its approval by
9	the Governor. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it
10	shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which
11	the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the
12	veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house
13	overrides the veto.
