15 AN ACT FOR THE STATE CRIME LABORATORY
16 - HOPE DRUG LABORATORY APPROPRIATION
17 FOR THE 2001-2003 BIENNIUM.
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - HOPE DRUG LABORATORY. There is hereby
24 established for the State Crime Laboratory - Hope Drug Laboratory for the
25 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose
26 salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and
27 Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all
28 laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a
29 specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt
30 from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All
31 persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the
32 provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas
33 Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - HOPE DRUG LABORATORY. There is hereby appropriated, to the State Crime Laboratory, to be payable from the State Central Services Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the State Crime Laboratory - Hope Drug Laboratory for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:

SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL OR TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer the sum of five hundred forty thousand six hundred sixty four dollars (\$540,664) from the Special State Assets Forfeiture Fund to the State Central Services Fund as a direct revenue to provide funds solely for the appropriations authorized herein for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003.

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2 *SECTION 4. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS.* Disbursement of funds authorized by
3 this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made
4 available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions
5 of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures
6 Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and
7 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this
8 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
9 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied
10 with in disbursement of said funds.

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12 *SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.* It is the intent of the General Assembly
13 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
14 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
15 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
16 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
17 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
18 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint
19 Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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21 *SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE.* It is found and determined by the General
22 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
23 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that due to the
24 extraordinary increase in the number of illicit drug laboratory and criminal
25 drug related cases filed additional state resources are needed to examine and
26 identify evidence turned over to the State Crime Laboratory; that the
27 effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is essential
28 to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are
29 provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the
30 delay in the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its passage and
31 approval could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and
32 provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is
33 hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate
34 preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and
35 effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

36 If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become

1 effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor
2 may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
3 overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the
4 veto.
