- 6 <u>(c) The State Board of Education shall review the Comprehensive Plan</u>
 7 for Consistency and Rigor in Course Work and revise as necessary based on the
 8 five-year cycle for school improvement plans required by the Arkansas

- 22 (f) If the Department of Education determines that a school district 23 has failed to align the academic subject area content of any academic course 24 in grades nine through twelve (9-12) to the Arkansas Curriculum Frameworks in 25 any school containing a combination of these grades, the Department of 26 Education shall cite the noncompliance of each school on the Standards for 27 Accreditation of Arkansas Public Schools Annual Report for the school and 28 shall file a noncompliance notation on the school's performance report under 29 § 6-15-1402.
- 30 <u>(g) The State Board of Education shall promulgate appropriate rules</u> 31 and regulations necessary to carry out the requirements of this act.
- 32 <u>(h) Nothing in the requirements of this act which targets academic</u>
 33 <u>subject area courses in grades nine through twelve (9-12) shall be construed</u>
 34 <u>to mean that public school districts are not to be held accountable for</u>
 35 <u>aligning the curriculum in grades kindergarten through twelve (K-12) to the</u>
 36 Arkansas Curriculum Frameworks for all subject matter areas.
