20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21

22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the  
23 Department of Correction for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum  
24 number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the  
25 provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code  
26 §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto.  
27 Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual  
28 salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of  
29 said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying  
30 positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the  
31 Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101),  
32 or its successor.

16 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and  
17 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by  
18 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization Law. Further, the General Assembly  
19 has determined that the Department of Correction and the Department of  
20 Community Correction may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is  
21 provided to the Board of Corrections authorizing broad powers under the  
22 Reallocation of Resources provisions herein. Therefore, it is both necessary  
23 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring  
24 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as  
25 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative  
26 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section.

 3 authorized herein shall not exceed an amount equal to five and one-half  
 4 percent (5.5%) of the annual salary authorized by law to any eligible  
 5 employee and shall only be made available to the personnel occupying the  
 6 following positions.

19 Employees assigned to these classifications may be eligible for hazardous  
 20 duty pay if the Director of the Department of Correction certifies to the  
 21 Chief Fiscal Officer that employees in these positions have been assigned

 23 increased risk of personal injury.

24

25 Employees in the above classifications who are assigned to maximum security  
 26 lockup areas, i.e. administrative, segregation, punitive isolation and death  
 27 row at the maximum security unit, Varner Unit, Cummins Unit, and East  
 28 Arkansas Regional Unit, are authorized to receive the hazardous duty pay  
 29 allowance and an additional amount of maximum security incentive pay to five  
 30 and one-half percent of the annual salary authorized by law. This pay will  
 31 only be paid while the employee continues to work in the maximum security  
 32 lockup areas and pay will be discontinued should the employee terminate work  
 33 in this area.

34

35 The amounts received under the provisions of this section shall not be  
 36 considered as exceeding the maximum authorized annual salary allowance for

1 employees in receipt of such amounts. Such amounts shall be considered as  
2 Regular Salary and the Department of Finance and Administration shall adopt  
3 the necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this provision.  
4

5 Employees covered by the provisions of this Section shall be eligible for  
6 special compensation for hazardous duty and additional compensation for  
7 maximum security assignment only upon a determination by the Chief Fiscal  
8 Officer of the State that sufficient general revenues are available to  
9 sustain payment of the additional compensation levels herein authorized. It  
10 is the intent of this section that such payments shall be optional, at the  
11 discretion of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the Director of the  
12 Department of Correction, dependent upon sufficient revenues and shall not be  
13 implemented using funds specifically set aside for other programs within the  
14 Department.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001

19 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

21 SERVICE CONTRACT. In the event the Department is able to contract with a

25 Fiscal Officer of the State and after receiving prior review by the

31 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HOLIDAY  
33 COMPENSATION. The Department of Correction is authorized to pay employees for  
34 up to ~~twelve (12)~~ ninety-six (96) hours of unused holidays exceeding a  
35 balance in the employee's holiday account of one-hundred fifty (150) hours  
36 following the end of the calendar year. Employees terminating employment from

1 the Department of Correction will be eligible for all holiday pay accrued  
 2 during the years of service. This request is contingent on approval by the

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27 SECTION 40. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INMATE  
29 COST STUDY.

30 (a) The Department of Correction, with the cooperation of the  
31 administrators of the several county jails, shall conduct a study of the  
32 various costs involved in the operation of county jails for the purpose of

 25 appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall  
 26 monitor the level of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly

8 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and  
9 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request , after having sought  
10 prior review by the Legislative Council.

11  
12 SECTION 42. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized  
13 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds  
14 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the  
15 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and  
16 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

26 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by

31 SECTION 44. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
32 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
33 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the  
34 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2001 is essential to the operation of  
35 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
36 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective

1 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the  
2 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
3 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
4 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
5 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2001.
