AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL SERVICES and operating expenses for the arkansas state UNI VERSI TY FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30 , 2003; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE ARKANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY
APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2001-2003
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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established for the Arkansas State University for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maxi mum number of regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation Act. All personsoccupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular Sal aries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the Arkansas State University for the 2001-2003 biennium, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: two thousand (2,000) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas State University, to be payable from the Arkansas State University Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Arkansas State University for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:


SECTION 5. APPROPRIATIONS - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Arkansas State University, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Arkansas State University, for personal services and operating expenses of the Arkansas State University for the biennial period ending June 30, 2003, the following:

SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, loCAL AND TEMPORARY LaW. SPECIAL ALLOWANCES. For the purpose of providing necessary allowances for housing and other unusual expenses incurred by or in behalf of the athletic director, assistant athletic directors, head coaches, and assistant coaches at Arkansas State University, the Board of Trustees may make special allowances available therefor in such amounts as the Board of Trustees may determine as justified, an equitable allowance in view of the unusual and exacting duties of said athletic director, assistant athletic directors, head coaches, and assistant coaches, and for the purpose of providing such allowances, the Board of Trustees is authorized to expend from the auxiliary income of the Arkansas State University, which is derived from athletic event receipts, an amount not to exceed twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) in the agregate for such purposes during each year of the 1999.2001 2001-2003 biennium for the athletic director and head coaches, and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in the aggregate for such purposes during the 1999.2001 2001-2003 biennium for the assistant athletic directors and assistant coaches. Provided that any such allowances shall be in addition to the regular salary of such athletic director, assistant athletic directors, head coaches and assistant coaches, as established herein provided that the amount of such allowance shall not exceed ten thousand dollars $(\$ 10,000)$ per annum for any one salaried position. Further, if the special
allowance funds authorized herein are utilized Arkansas State University shall report annually to the Legislative Joint Auditing Committee the exact disposition of those special allowance funds.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 through lune 30, 2003.

SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO the ARKANSAS CODE nor published Separately as special, local and temporary law. reallocation of RESOURCES. Upon determination by the President of Arkansas State University that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or consolidation of administrative functions within the university is necessary for efficient and effective operations of the university, the president, with approval of the Arkansas State University Board of Trustees, may have the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of Arkansas State University. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General Assembly. The transfers, consolidation, or reorganization which involve academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education and the Legislative Council.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,2001 through June 30, 2003.

SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE nor published separately as special, local and temporary law. leases. Not withstanding any law to the contrary, the Board of Trustees of Arkansas State University may hereafter lease facilities or operations for room and board purposes in any manner and upon terms the board deems to be in the best interest of the university. Action taken under this act shall be by written resolution adopted by at least a majority of the members of the board.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from」uly 1, 2001 through June 30, 2003.

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            SECTION 9. NOT TO be INCORPORATED I NTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES. (A) For alI
appropriations as provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall
monitor the level of fund bal ances in relation to expenditures on a monthly
basis. If any proposed expenditures would cause a fund balance to decline to
less than fifty percent (50%) of the bal ance available on |uly 1, 2001, the
disbursing officer shall i mmedi ately notify the executive head of the agency.
Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency
head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
include the following:
1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
expenditures on the fund bal ance.
2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut or
any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund bal ances will not
Leopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
depletion of the fund bal ance.
(B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
prior review by the Legislative Council.
SECTION 10. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Acounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control I aws of this state, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.
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SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, Ietters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on لuly 1,2001 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond لuly 1, 2001 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after لuly 1, 2001.
