10	(a) On or before January 1, 2004, every school district shall develop
11	plans to provide for the safety of employees and students in the event of a
12	terrorist attack, specifically including contingency plans for attacks using
13	biological agents, the use of nerve gas, or similar chemical agents,
14	affecting the school and in the event of war affecting the school.
15	(b) To the extent practical, students should participate in practice
16	drills executing the plans.
