25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

27	SECTION 1. (a) The purpose of this act is to ensure that faculty
28	advisors at universities provide students with course selection advice that
29	will enable a full-time student to obtain most bachelor's degrees within
30	eight (8) semesters.
31	(b) Any person assigned by a university to provide course selection
32	advice to incoming freshman students shall provide any student who has
33	declared a major with a written, eight (8) semester course of study signed by
34	either the institution's chief operating officer, president, or dean that
35	provides a recommended sequence for all course requirements for completion of



1 most bachelor's degrees within eight (8) semesters. 2 (c)(1)(A) Any student who chooses a bachelor's degree designed to be 3 completed within eight (8) semesters may commit to completion of the degree 4 requirements within eight (8) semesters by signing and returning a copy of 5 the written, eight-semester course of study to the university's advising 6 center or the student's assigned academic advisor. 7 (B) If a student does not choose to commit to completion 8 of the degree requirements within eight (8) semesters, the institution shall 9 obtain a signed, written waiver from the student which clearly outlines the 10 student's rights under this section and verifies that the student chooses to 11 not enter into the commitment. If no waiver is obtained, the institution 12 will be deemed to have guaranteed a bachelor's degree as provided by this 13 section. 14 (2) A student shall be guaranteed a bachelor's degree at the end 15 of the eight (8) semesters if the student: 16 (A) Commits to completion of his or her bachelor degree 17 requirements within eight (8) semesters as set forth under subdivision (c)(1) 18 of this section; 19 (B) Makes satisfactory academic progress; 20 (C) Fulfills all of the course requirements set forth in 21 the signed, written, eight-semester course of study in the recommended 22 sequence; and 23 (D) Does not change his or her declared major. 24 (d)(1) Each university shall publish a recommended course sequence and 25 recommended schedule by semester for each degree offered by the university. 26 (2) The recommended course sequence schedule shall be included 27 in the university's course catalog and departmental publications and on the 28 university's website. 29 (3) Each university shall offer and make available courses in a time, sequence, and manner that will enable students to complete requirements 30 for a degree within the time frame set out in the recommended course sequence 31 32 schedule. 33 (e) Only universities that implement procedures in compliance with 34 this act shall be approved by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating 35 Board to receive funding from the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship 36 Program or the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program.
