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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24 SECTION 1. (a) By July 1, 2005, the Assessment Coordination
25 Department shall adopt and implement by rules final specifications for
26 computer assisted mass appraisal software.

27 (b)(1) The rules may provide a procedure by which the Assessment
28 Coordination Department may directly compensate computer assisted mass
29 appraisal software providers who are in compliance with requirements set
30 forth in the final specifications for computer assisted mass appraisal
31 software.

32 (2) The Assessment Coordination Department shall require
33 computer assisted mass appraisal software providers to comply with
34 requirements set forth in the final specifications for computer assisted mass
35 appraisal software.



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SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Assessment Coordination Department needs to adopt and implement by rules final specifications for computer assisted mass appraisal software; that the rules need to be in place to protect counties conducting reappraisals; and that this act is immediately necessary because delaying implementation would cause irreparable delays in the proper assessments for property. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:

(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
