10	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
11	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that Act 1366 of 2003, known as the		
12	Homeland Security Information Act, is necessary for the safety and protection		
13	of the citizens of the State of Arkansas; that without legislative action the		
14	Homeland Security Information Act will expire on July 1, 2005; and that this		
15	act is immediately necessary to prevent the expiration of the act.		
16	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately
