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23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the

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Department of Human Services - Division of Behavioral Health for the 2005-

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2007 biennium, the following maximum number of regular employees whose

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salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the Uniform Classification

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and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et seq.), or its successor,

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and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however, that any position to

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which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein in dollars, shall be

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exempt from the provisions of said Uniform Classification and Compensation

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Act. All persons occupying positions authorized herein are hereby governed

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by the provisions of the Regular Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act

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(Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its successor.

14 Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health
15 Center who receive care at these inpatient facilities shall be provided to
16 the inpatient facilities at the contract rate unless the funds available for
17 this purpose have been exhausted. Available funding as determined by the
18 Director of the Department of Human Services shall be apportioned on a per
19 capita basis up to a maximum of three dollars and forty-eight cents (\$3.48)
20 per capita for fiscal year ~~2003-2004~~ 2005-2006 and three dollars and forty-
21 eight cents (\$3.48) per capita for fiscal year ~~2004-2005~~ 2006-2007. The 2000
22 federal population census shall be used in determining the population of each
23 catchment area of the fifteen Community Mental Health Centers. All amounts
24 appropriated under this section shall be used by Community Mental Health
25 Centers for residents of each center's catchment area and such funds shall
26 only be accessed as the payment of last resort.
27

28 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

30 REPORTING. The Division of Behavioral Mental Health Services shall develop an
31 evaluation and monitoring program that will assure all expenditures are made
32 consistent with the intent of these appropriations. As a condition for
33 receiving funds under this Act, Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) shall
34 report quarterly to the Division of Behavioral Mental Health Services the
35 following data:

36 (1) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions

- 1 referred by CMHCs to community-based settings;
- 2 (2) the number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent admissions
- 3 to community-based settings receiving assistance from the acute mental health
- 4 services funds;
- 5 (3) the total number of acute bed days utilized by these involuntary
- 6 commitments;
- 7 (4) the total number of bed days utilized by these medically indigent
- 8 admissions;
- 9 (5) the average length of stay of admissions for these involuntary
- 10 commitments per catchment area;
- 11 (6) the average length of stay of admissions for these medically indigent
- 12 admissions per catchment area;
- 13 (7) the number of medically indigent admissions per catchment area unable to
- 14 receive assistance from the acute mental health services funds due to such
- 15 funds being depleted by prior admissions;
- 16 (8) the number of re-admissions per catchment area for involuntary
- 17 commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings
- 18 receiving assistance from the acute mental health services; and
- 19 (9) identify any steps taken by CMHCs to improve access to acute mental
- 20 health services.

21

22 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE

24 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES – PER CAPITA – LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The

25 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of

26 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago

27 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly

28 also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public

29 mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care.

30 The purpose of ~~this Act~~ the Acute Mental Health Services – Per Capita

31 appropriation is to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services

32 to be utilized within community-based settings for the treatment and care of

33 medically indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary

34 commitments to the public mental health system. The appropriation for acute

35 mental health services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community

36 Mental Health Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral

1 ~~Mental Health Services~~ of the Department of Human Services for use within
2 community-based settings and facilities.

3
4 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. DRUG
6 COURT RULES AND REGULATIONS. The Department of Human Services - Division of
7 Behavioral ~~Mental~~ Health Services shall develop administrative rules and
8 regulations regarding the distribution of monies from the Magnum Drug Court
9 Fund and shall submit such rules and regulations to the Arkansas Legislative
10 Council or Joint Budget Committee for review.

11
12 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COMMUNITY
14 ALCOHOL SAFETY CARRY FORWARD. Such Community Alcohol Safety appropriation as
15 is authorized in this Act which remains at the end of the first fiscal year
16 of the biennium may be carried forward into the second fiscal year of the
17 biennium there to be used for the same purposes.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from ~~July 1, 2003~~
19 July 1, 2005 through ~~June 30, 2005~~ June 30, 2007.

20
21 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE
23 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES - SOUTHEAST ARKANSAS BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CENTER. Of the
24 total amount appropriated each fiscal year in Section 9 of this Act for Acute
25 Mental Health Services - Per Capita, two hundred fifty thousand dollars
26 (\$250,000) each fiscal year shall first be allocated and made available to
27 the Southeast Arkansas Behavioral Health Center for Acute Mental Health
28 Services. The remaining five million five hundred thousand dollars
29 (\$5,500,000) appropriated each fiscal year shall be allocated and made
30 available to the Community Mental Health Centers within community-based
31 settings on a per-capita basis.

32
33 The Division of Behavioral Health will work with the community mental health
34 centers and shall develop an equitable acute care distribution plan which
35 considers utilization of State Hospital beds, clarifying target population,
36 and other pertinent demographic factors to ensure maximum equitable

1 utilization of public funds.

2
3 The Division of Behavioral Health shall report this distribution plan to the
4 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee by July 1, 2006. The
5 intent of the 85th General Assembly is that this language is for the 2005-07
6 biennium only and shall not be requested by the Division of Behavioral Health
7 as continuing special language for the 2007-09 biennium.

8
9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
10 through June 30, 2007.

11
12 SECTION 32. Arkansas Code § 19-5-1043, concerning the Drug Abuse
13 Prevention and Treatment Fund, is amended to read as follows:

14 19-5-1043. Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Fund.

15 (a) There is hereby established on the books of the Treasurer of State,
16 Auditor of State, and Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as
17 the Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Fund.

18 (b) This fund shall consist of:

19 (1) Those ~~those~~ moneys transferred or deposited from the State
20 Administration of Justice Fund;

21 (2) Such General Revenue as transferred from Mental Health Services Fund
22 Account;

23 (3) Federal reimbursement received on account of eligible expenditures;
24 and

25 (4) Other funds as may be provided by law.

26
27 SECTION 33. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
28 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
29 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
30 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
31 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
32 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
33 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
34 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
35 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

36

1 SECTION 34. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
2 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
3 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
4 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
5 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
6 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
7 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
8 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

9
10 SECTION 35. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
11 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
12 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
13 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
14 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
15 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
16 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
17 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
18 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
19 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
20 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
