24	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General		
25	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that crime is a threat to the safety to the		
26	citizens of the State of Arkansas; that additional certified law enforcement		
27	officers can reduce the threat of crime; and that this act is immediately		
28	necessary because it will avoid delay in increasing the number of law		
29	enforcement officers that can arrest offenders of the laws of the State of		
30	Arkansas. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being		
31	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and		
32	safety shall become effective on:		
33	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
