23	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT FUND. There is hereby

25	from the General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, the

27	(A) For construction and renovation of County District Fairs, the sum of

29	SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
30	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPERATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
31	PROCEDURES. As soon as it is feasible after the effective date of this Act,
32	the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission shall notify the various
33	district and county livestock show associations to file applications with the
34	Commission for grant funds appropriated in Section 1, to make needed
35	improvements at the various livestock shows. Each County Livestock

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1	Association shall receive a maximum of seven thousand two hundred dollars
2	(\$7,200). Provided, that any county having two county seats or two county
3	livestock shows shall be considered a single county for the purposes of this
4	Act and the funds allocated to any such county shall be divided equally
5	between the two county livestock associations. Provided further, that any
6	county having a county livestock show in a county seat other than the
7	district of the county in which a district livestock show is located and
8	which has heretofore received state aid, shall be considered a separate
9	county. Each District Livestock Association and the 4 States Fair
10	Association shall be entitled to receive a maximum of forty eight thousand
11	<u>dollars (\$48,000).</u>
12	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
13	through June 30, 2007.

15	SECTION 3. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor
16	obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects
17	described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available
18	therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and
19	agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and
20	donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or
21	funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State
22	Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects
23	enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds
24	otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
25	Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
26	not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.
27	(B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing
28	Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue

7	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
8	Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
9	appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
10	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
11	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
12	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
13	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
14	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
15	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
16	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
17	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
