36	sale of prescription drugs threatens the health and safety of the citizens of

1	this state; and that this act is necessary because only the explicit
2	prohibition created by this act will allow the federal intervention necessary
3	to interdict unlicensed and unregulated Internet sales of prescription drugs
4	to Arkansas citizens. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
5	act being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
6	safety shall become effective on:
7	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
8	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
9	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
10	<pre>bill; or</pre>
11	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
12	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
