10 ACT FOR EDUCATION AND TRAINING ON THE PREVENTION

12 OTHER PURPOSES.

14 TO CREATE THE SPOUSAL ABUSE SAFETY PLAN  
15 ACT FOR EDUCATION AND TRAINING ON THE  
16 PREVENTION OF AND INTERVENTION IN  
17 SPOUSAL ABUSE.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 9, Chapter 15 is amended to add an  
24 additional subchapter to read as follows:

25 9-15-401. Title.

26 This subchapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Spousal Abuse  
27 Safety Plan Act".  
28

29 9-15-402. Findings – Purpose.

30 (a) The General Assembly finds that:

31 (1) There are many resources to support victims of domestic  
32 abuse after the abuse has occurred. However, the issues of how to prevent  
33 spousal abuse and the possible solution of creating a safety plan for the  
34 spouse and the children in the household have received very little attention;

35 (2) Exposure to domestic abuse and spousal abuse has a



1 devastating impact on both the children and adults in households and  
2 communities, regardless of whether they are direct victims of abuse or  
3 witnesses to it; and

4 (3) Children exposed to such violence at an early age are likely  
5 to become either perpetrators of abuse or victims of violence in adulthood,  
6 which is a cycle that can only be stopped through intervention and education.

7 (b) The purpose of this subchapter is to reduce the occurrence of  
8 spousal abuse and to reduce the exposure of children to spousal abuse by  
9 creating a safety plan for the spouse that is a victim of the spousal abuse  
10 and for the children in the household.

11  
12 9-15-403. Definitions.

13 As used in this subchapter:

14 (1) "Emotional abuse" means any of the following acts:

15 (A) Verbally attacking or threatening a spouse by yelling,  
16 screaming, or name-calling;

17 (B) Using criticism, social isolation, intimidation, or  
18 exploitation to dominate a spouse;

19 (C) Criminally harassing a spouse;

20 (D) Stalking a spouse;

21 (E) Threatening a spouse or his or her loved ones;

22 (F) Damaging a spouse's possessions; or

23 (G) Harming the pet of a spouse;

24 (2)(A) "Physical abuse" means any of the following acts:

25 (i) Using physical force in a way that injures a  
26 spouse or puts him or her at risk of being injured;

27 (ii) Beating, hitting, shaking, pushing, choking,  
28 biting, burning, kicking, or assaulting a spouse with a weapon.

29 (B) "Physical abuse" may consist of one (1) or more than  
30 one (1) incident described under subdivision (2)(A) of this section;

31 (3)(A) "Sexual abuse" means any of the following acts:

32 (i) Forcing a spouse to participate in unwanted,  
33 unsafe, or degrading sexual activity; or

34 (ii) Using ridicule or other tactics to try to  
35 denigrate, control, or limit a spouse's sexuality or reproductive choices.

36 (B) "Sexual abuse" includes rape, sexual assault, or

1 sexual harassment;

2 (4)(A) "Spousal abuse" means an act of violence or mistreatment  
3 that a woman or a man may experience at the hands of his or her marital  
4 partner, regardless of the timing of the act in terms of the stage of the  
5 relationship.

6 (B) "Spousal abuse" includes any of the following  
7 committed by a spouse against his or her spouse:

8 (i) Emotional abuse;

9 (ii) Physical abuse; or

10 (iii) Sexual abuse.

11  
12 9-15-404. Safety plans and education.

13 The purpose of the Spousal Abuse Safety Plan Act is to:

14 (1) Develop increased and improved security measures that  
15 provide greater protection for victims of spousal abuse, especially those who  
16 have orders of protection;

17 (2) Help victims create a safety plan to keep them and their  
18 children as safe as possible by developing publications as described under §  
19 9-15-405 on what to do and where to go if danger occurs;

20 (3) Make safety plan publications as described under § 9-15-405  
21 available in public health centers and for distribution to victims by police  
22 officers when responding to spousal abuse calls;

23 (3) Create special training initiatives regarding the dynamics  
24 of spousal abuse for police intake officers, health officials, and social  
25 workers in order to help ensure a continuously improving response to spousal  
26 abuse;

27 (4) Encourage the development of community-based, civic-based,  
28 and faith-based healthy relationship courses to teach to both adolescent boys  
29 and adolescent girls as they begin to date:

30 (A) The elements of healthy relationships;

31 (B) Acceptable and unacceptable behavior in relationships;

32 (C) The concept of respect;

33 (D) Conflict resolution techniques;

34 (E) Anti-violence; and

35 (F) The prevention of sexual assault and sexual  
36 harassment;
