11 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

14 AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS EVALUATION  
15 CENTER.  
16

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
19

20 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 5, is amended to add an  
21 additional subchapter to read as follows:

22 6-5-1001. Legislative findings.

23 The General Assembly finds:

24 (1) Effective evaluation serves to enhance quality in existing  
25 services and programs by:

26 (A) Ensuring accountability for funds and services used;

27 (B) Raising the bar for standards and expectations; and

28 (C) Increasing the use of data to inform program operation  
29 and decision making.

30 (2) The general focus of effective evaluation is on programs and  
31 services, but effective evaluation can be applied also to individuals,  
32 organizations, communities, and societies or cultures.

33 (3) In a state where resources are often scarce, effective and  
34 credible evaluation is the heart of a healthy system and is critical to  
35 ensure that necessary programs and services are delivered and ineffective



1 programs and practices eliminated.

2 (4) To help groups accomplish their objectives, empowerment  
3 evaluation and other collaborative forms of evaluation are particularly  
4 useful in collaborative endeavors that require complex systems and diverse  
5 groups.

7 6-5-1002. The Arkansas Evaluation Center.

8 (a) There is established at the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff  
9 the Arkansas Evaluation Center to build evaluation capacity in the State of  
10 Arkansas by:

11 (1) Assisting nonprofit corporations in their reporting  
12 processes to their boards, funding agencies, the government, and the public;

13 (2) Expanding the service of evaluation research to nonprofit  
14 corporations in the Arkansas Delta through the provision of data that helps  
15 to account for resources and through a service delivery designed to advance  
16 the quality of life in the Arkansas Delta;

17 (3) Assisting the General Assembly by evaluating the impact of  
18 potential and existing legislation; and

19 (4) Fulfilling a commitment to fiscal and philosophical  
20 accountability with the people of Arkansas by empowering the University of  
21 Arkansas at Pine Bluff to provide nationally-recognized evaluation training.

22 (b) The Arkansas Evaluation Center shall be housed at the University  
23 of Arkansas at Pine Bluff.

24  
25 6-5-1003. Duties of the Arkansas Evaluation Center.

26 (a) The Arkansas Evaluation Center shall:

27 (1) Contribute to the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff by:

28 (A) Attracting students to existing courses;

29 (B) Providing new online and distance learning courses;

30 and

31 (C) Serving as a catalyst to stimulate university faculty  
32 to conduct evaluation and research.

33 (2) Provide academic training that consists of a variety of  
34 modalities, including courses, virtual classrooms, practicum, workshops, and  
35 invited speakers;

36 (3) Assist the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff in offering

1 a series of evaluation-related courses, including qualitative or ethnographic  
2 approaches, statistics, research design, evaluation approaches and methods,  
3 and politics of evaluation, that will be provided primarily through the  
4 university's Education Department; and

5 (4) Assist the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff in  
6 developing and implementing the Certificate Program in Effective Evaluation  
7 and the Masters Degree Program in Effective Evaluation.

8 (b) The center shall provide training on evaluation to a cadre of  
9 professionals interested in pursuing study in evaluation through course work,  
10 evaluation conference workshops, and invited lectures delivered by recognized  
11 experts.
