

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND 2 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding for that appropriation that is 3 4 not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for Special Needs 5 Isolated Funding in Section 7 1 of this Act and shall be used there for fully 6 funding each subsection (c) through (f) of A.C.A. §6-20-604 Act 1452 7 continuing sequentially by subsection until the available funds are 8 exhausted.

SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 12 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO 13 14 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School 15 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a 16 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 17 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 18 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is 19 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend 20 21 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 22 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 23 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school 24 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 25 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act 26 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 27 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. Such 28 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 29 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 30 as is deemed necessary.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2005}{32}$ 32 $\frac{2007}{2007}$ through June 30, $\frac{2007}{2009}$.

34 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
 36 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special

1 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide 2 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such 3 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are 4 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute 5 6 such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section. 7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005 8 2007 through June 30, 2007 2009.

10 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 12 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time 13 14 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 15 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the 16 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation 17 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State 18 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-19 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount 20 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public 21 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or 22 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public 23 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement". 24

SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
established by the State Board of Education.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2005}{31}$ 31 $\frac{2007}{2007}$ through June 30, $\frac{2007}{2009}$.

33 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 35 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
 36 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with

1 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

2 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
3 <u>2007</u> through June 30, 2007 <u>2009</u>.

SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 5 6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 7 AUTHORITY. The Director of the Department of Education, with the approval of 8 the Chief Fiscal Officer and after approval by the Arkansas Legislative 9 Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to request necessary 10 appropriation transfers and any other budget related adjustments necessary. 11 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 12 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 13 14 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 15 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 16 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 17 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 18 if some flexibility is provided to the Director of the Department of 19 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 20 21 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 22 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The 23 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 24 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by 25 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional 26 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005

30 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 32 ASSESSMENT/END-OF-LEVEL COURSE TESTING. Of the total amount appropriated for 33 Assessment/End-of-Level Course Testing for each fiscal year of the 2005-2007 34 <u>2007-2009</u> biennium, up to \$500,000 may be authorized by the Director of the 35 Department of Education to be used to provide staff development training for 36 educational cooperatives, school districts, and for Department of Education

staff on such content areas as test interpretation, goal setting, educational
 plan development, curriculum development, instructional strategies, classroom
 management and for evaluation procedures.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2005
5 <u>2007</u> through June 30, 2007 <u>2009</u>.

7 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN 9 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds authorized herein to the Department of Education - for the Quiz Bowl each 10 11 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed 40% forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) 12 each fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the 13 14 Quiz Bowl.

15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2005}{2007}$ through June 30, $\frac{2007}{2009}$.

SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 20 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education 21 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation 22 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal 23 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred 24 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Odyssey of the Mind Creativity in 25 Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, 26 thirteen thousand five hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for 27 Destination Imagination, and five thousand dollars (\$5,000) each fiscal year 28 for the State History Day Competition. The Department of Education shall 29 allocate General Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred thirty two 30 thousand dollars (\$132,000) each fiscal year from the Department of Education 31 Public School Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, 32 the Odyssey of the Mind Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 33 each for students and chaperones, Destination Imagination, and the State 34 History Day Competition. The Department shall either expend or have committed for expenditure the monies allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Odyssey of the Mind 35 36 Creativity in Arkansas, Inc., Destination Imagination, and the State History

1 Day Competition as authorized herein in order to fulfill the provisions of 2 this section.

19	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
20	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
21	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
