9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE  
10 MILITARY DEPARTMENT FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT  
11 PROJECTS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

15 AN ACT FOR THE STATE MILITARY  
16 DEPARTMENT GENERAL IMPROVEMENT  
17 APPROPRIATION.  
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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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22 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - GENERAL IMPROVEMENT. There is hereby  
23 appropriated, to the State Military Department, to be payable from the  
24 General Improvement Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, the  
25 following:

26 (A) For the Armory Rehabilitation Project Phase III for major maintenance,  
27 renovation and repair projects for State Armories, the sum of  
28 .....\$10,000,000.

29 (B) For construction and renovation of the Civilian Student Training  
30 Program's Training and Activity Center, the sum of .....\$500,000.

31 (C) For renovations to comply with ADA requirements, the sum of  
32 .....\$750,000.

33 (D) For construction of the West Memphis Armory, the sum of  
34 .....\$2,013,051.

35 (E) For providing matching funds for Federal monies for construction



1 projects for Camp Robinson, the sum of .....\$3,000,000.

2 (F) For major maintenance, repair and rehabilitation for Armories, the sum  
3 of .....\$2,000,000.

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5 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - FEDERAL. There is hereby appropriated, to the  
6 State Military Department, to be payable from the federal funds as designated  
7 by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the following:

8 (A) For construction of the Jonesboro Armed Forces Reserve Center and  
9 Field Maintenance Shop, the sum of .....\$24,419,481.

10 (B) For the Armory Rehabilitation Project Phase III for major maintenance,  
11 renovation and repair projects for State Armories, the sum of ...\$10,000,000.

12 (C) For construction and renovation of the Deputy Chief of Staff Personnel  
13 (DCSPER) Addition, the sum of .....\$750,000.

14 (D) For renovations to comply with ADA requirements, the sum of  
15 .....\$750,000.

16 (E) For construction and renovation of Army Modular Forces (AMF) Army  
17 Organization Parking, the sum of .....\$3,127,320.

18 (F) For construction and renovation of Army Modular Forces (AMF) facility  
19 interior renovations, the sum of .....\$2,223,908.

20 (G) For construction of the Northwest Arkansas Armed Forces Reserve  
21 Center, the sum of .....\$23,226,986.

22 (H) For construction of the Regional Training Institute Phase II, the sum  
23 of .....\$34,321,930.

24 (I) For construction of the Searcy Field Maintenance Shop, the sum of  
25 .....\$7,481,360.

26 (J) For construction of the Fort Chaffee Combined Army Collective Training  
27 Facility, the sum of .....\$26,481,358.

28 (K) For construction of the Fort Chaffee Convoy Live Fire/Entry Control  
29 Point, the sum of .....\$4,486,004.

30 (L) For construction and renovation of the CMTC (Chaffee Maneuver Training  
31 Center) Sewer Collection System, the sum of .....\$3,220,223.

32 (M) For construction of the West Memphis Armory, the sum of  
33 .....\$6,039,152.

34 (N) For construction of the Fort Chaffee Infantry Platoon Battle Course,  
35 the sum of .....\$3,926,000.

36 (O) For construction of the Fort Chaffee Infantry Squad Battle Course, the

1 sum of .....\$6,166,000.

2 (P) For construction of the Convoy Live Fire/Entry Control Point, the sum  
3 of .....\$4,430,000.

4 (Q) For construction and renovation projects for Camp Robinson, the sum of  
5 .....\$3,000,000.

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7 SECTION 3. DISBURSEMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be awarded nor  
8 obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects  
9 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available  
10 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and  
11 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and  
12 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or  
13 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State  
14 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects  
15 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds  
16 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General  
17 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall  
18 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

19 (B) The restrictions of any applicable provisions of the State Purchasing  
20 Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue  
21 Stabilization Law and any other applicable fiscal control laws of this State  
22 and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration,  
23 as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of any  
24 funds provided by this act unless specifically provided otherwise by law.

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26 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
27 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
28 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
29 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
30 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
31 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
32 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
33 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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35 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
36 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the

1 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
2 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2009 is essential to the operation of  
3 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
4 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
5 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2009 could work irreparable harm upon the  
6 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
7 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
8 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
9 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2009.
