6	(a) A heritage trail shall:
7	(1)(A) Be a trail or route established by historic use and shall
8	be historically significant as a result of that historic use.
9	(B) A route shall not be required to exist as a
10	discernible trail to qualify as a heritage trail, but its location shall be
11	sufficiently known to permit evaluation of historical interest potential;
12	(2)(A) Accurately follow the historic route with some deviations

14	enhance the public's enjoyment of the heritage trail.
15	(B) Trail segments no longer possible to travel by trail

23	(a) The Department of Parks and Tourism, in consultation with the

26	studies to determine the feasibility of designating additional trails as
27	heritage trails.
28	(b) Studies under this section shall include without limitation:
29	(1) The proposed route of the trail;
30	(2) The areas adjacent to the trail to be utilized for historic

32	(3) The characteristics making the trail worthy of designation
33	as a state heritage trail and its historic significance;
34	(4) The current ownership status of the land and the current and

9	(3) The Rock Roe Landing connection to the Memphis to Little
10	Rock Road from where Rock Roe enters the White River to the Memphis to Little

12	(4) The Cadron to Arkansas Post Road;
13	(5) The Little Rock to Fort Smith Road section to Potts old
14	place north of Potts Tavern;
15	(6) The Little Rock to Fort Smith and Fort Gibson section from
16	Potts to Fort Smith crossing the Arkansas River at Dardanelle;
17	(7) The Upper Cut road;
18	(8) The Little Rock to Washington road;
19	(9) The Old Fort Towson road from Washington to American Indian
20	territory;
21	(10) The Antoine to Fort Towson Road;
22	(11) The Ecore Fabre to Washington Route; and
23	(12 The Ecore Fabre to Point Chicot Road.
