## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT REGARDING EXISTING STAFF EMPLOYED BY THE  
10 ATTORNEY GENERAL WHOSE SALARY IS PAID WITH FUNDS BY  
11 THE CRIME VICTIMS REPARATIONS REVOLVING FUND;  
12 DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

15 REGARDING EXISTING STAFF EMPLOYED BY THE  
16 ATTORNEY GENERAL WHOSE SALARY IS PAID  
17 WITH FUNDS BY THE CRIME VICTIMS  
18 REPARATIONS REVOLVING FUND AND DECLARING  
19 AN EMERGENCY.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
24

25 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 16-90-706(a)(4), regarding the Attorney  
26 General's responsibility to the Crime Victims Reparations Board, is amended  
27 to read as follows:

28 (4)(A) The board shall be provided such office, support staff, and  
29 secretarial services as necessary by the office of the Attorney General.

30 (B) The support staff and secretarial services described in this  
31 subdivision may also be assigned by the Attorney General to engage in  
32 additional legal work in other areas that do not involve crime victims  
33 reparations.  
34

35 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
36 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Attorney General has



1 immediate staffing needs in other areas of the agency; and that this act is  
2 immediately necessary because it will allow the Attorney General the  
3 flexibility to assign existing staff to work in other areas of the agency in  
4 addition to their responsibilities for the Crime Victims Reparations program.  
5 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately  
6 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall  
7 become effective on:

8 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

9 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,  
10 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the  
11 bill; or

12 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
13 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
