29	(2) Licensed physicians who were dispensing in the ordinary		
30	course of their practice for the twelve (12) months immediately prior to July		
31	4, 1983 before the effective date of this act, shall be exempt from the		
32	requirements of this subsection.		
33	(3) The board shall determine whether need exists for a		
34	physician to dispense a specific legend drug to the physician's patient for a		
35	patient's personal use and administration outside of the physician's office		
36	based on such information as is necessary for the board to determine:		

1	(A) The legend drug or drugs that the physician requests	
2	to dispense;	
3	(B) The ability of a physician's patient to obtain the	
4	legend drug from other medical professionals;	
5	(C) The availability of the legend drug to be prescribed	
6	by the physician;	
7	(D) The hours at which the legend drug may be obtained	
8	from other medical professionals;	
9	(E) The distance the physician's patient must travel to	
10	obtain the legend drug from other medical professionals;	
11	(F) Whether the physician has been investigated by the	
12	board concerning the improper prescribing or use of a legend drug;	
13	(G) Whether the physician has a financial relationship	
14	with the manufacturer of a legend drug that would create the appearance of a	
15	conflict of interest;	
16	(H) Whether the physician dispensing a legend drug will	
17	foster cost containment through improved efficiency and productivity; and	
18	(I) The procedures the physician has implemented to:	
19	(i) Assure compliance with the requirements of	
20	subsection (c) of this section;	
21	(ii) Monitor and guard against potential drug	
22	<u>interactions;</u>	
23	(iii) Store and safeguard the legend drugs; and

29	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
30	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that this act regulates the	
31	dispensing of legend drugs; that physicians and patients require certainty	
32	about the prescriptive authority of physicians and the availability of legen	
33	drugs; that a delay between the passage of this act and the effectiveness of	
34	this act will create uncertainty about the prescriptive authority of	
35	physicians and the availability of legend drugs. Therefore, an emergency is	
36	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the	

<u>preservatio</u>	on of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
<u>on:</u>	
	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor
the expirat	tion of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
<i>bill; or</i>	
	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
overridden,	the date the last house overrides the veto.
